AMENDING RESOLUTION NUMBER 325 OF 2023, ENTITLED "AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 69, 2022, A RESOLUTION (AS AMENDED) ENTITLED 'AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND OTHER APPROPRIATE OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF SCRANTON TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY ACTIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF SIXTY-EIGHT MILLION, SEVEN HUNDRED AND FORTY-SIX THOUSAND AND FIFTY DOLLARS (\$68,746,050.00)' TO REALLOCATE FUNDS FROM VARIOUS, BUDGETED ARPA ACCOUNTS TO ALLOW FOR FOCUS AND FUNDING OF DISASTER RELIEF EFFORTS AND STORMWATER MITIGATION, DEVELOPMENT AND REMEDIATION OF POOL COMPLEXES WITHIN THE CITY, AND TO EFFECTUATE ONGOING STEWARDSHIP OF TAXPAYER DOLLARS (AS AMENDED)", AS AMENDED, TO REBUDGET FUNDS.

WHEREAS, §6-13 (B) of the City's Administrative Code provides that expenditures from the City's revenue fund may be made upon the express approval of City Council; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 69, 2022, A Resolution Entitled 'Authorizing the Mayor and Other Appropriate Officials of the City of Scranton to take all necessary actions to implement The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Grant Funds in the amount of Sixty-Eight Million, Seven Hundred and Forty-Six Thousand And Fifty Dollars (\$68,746,050.00)' was passed and later amended; and

WHEREAS, since City Council's passing of Resolution No. 69, 2022, and its amendments, various allocations contained therein have not moved forward due to undersubscription and other projects have come in under budget; and

WHEREAS, in order to put these funds to better use, the City is proposing that those funds be transferred to allow for other projects that have exceeded initial budget projections; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Scranton to amend the ARPA Budget in line with the proposed reallocations, as amended and outlined herein and below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCRANTON that Resolution No. 325, 2023, as amended, be further amended by transferring funds as follows:





SECTION 3. This Resolution is enacted by the Council of the City of Scranton under the authority of the Act of Legislature, April 13, 1972, Act No. 62, known as the "Home Rule Charter and Option Plans Law" and any other applicable law arising under the laws of the State of Pennsylvania.
