PLEASE OBSERVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING LOCAL LAWS WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE

- 1. Each local law shall be filed with the Secretary of State within 20 days after its final adoption or approval as required by section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law. The cited statute provides that a local law shall not become effective before it is filed in the office of the Secretary of State.
- 2. Each local law to be filed with the Secretary of State shall be an original certified copy.
- 3. Each local law shall be filed on a form provided by the Department of State. If additional pages are required, they must be the same size as the form. Typewritten copies of the text may be attached to the form. Only legible copies will be accepted.
- 4. File only the number, title and text of the local law.
- 5. In the case of a local law amending a previously enacted local law, the text must be that of the law as amended. Do <u>not</u> include any matter in brackets, with a line through it, italicized or underscored to indicate the changes made. The printed number of the bill and explanatory matter must be omitted.
- 6. For the purpose of filing a local law with the Department of State, number each local law consecutively, beginning with the number one for the first local law filed in each calendar year. The next number in sequence should be applied to each local law when it is submitted for filing, regardless of its date of introduction or adoption. The date of filing of a local law is the date on which the local law is placed on file by the Department.

It is suggested that municipalities use introductory identifying bill numbers for proposed local laws. After the local law is enacted (and approved by the voters, if required), the local law should then be numbered with the next consecutive local law number, as described above, and then submitted to the Department for filing.

- 7. Each copy of a local law filed with the Secretary of State shall have affixed to it a certification by the Clerk of the County legislative body or the City, Town or Village Clerk or other officer designated by the local legislative body. Certification forms are provided herewith.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 116-2 (DEFINITIONS AND WORD USAGE) OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF SOUTHAMPTON BY ADDING AND AMENDING DEFINITION(S) TO SUPPORT CODE CHANGES TO DIMENSIONAL REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENCE YARDS

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Southampton is considering A Local Law Amending Chapter 116-2 (Definitions And Word Usage) of the Village Code of Southampton by adding and amending definition(s) to support code changes to dimensional regulations for residence yards; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board of Trustees hereby assumes Lead Agency status as there are no other involved agencies and issues a Negative Declaration pursuant to SEQRA as there are no significant negative environmental impacts anticipated by this zoning amendment; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 13 of 2024 is hereby adopted as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 13 OF 2024

A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 116-2 (Definitions and Word Usage) of the Village Code of Southampton by adding and amending Definition(s) to Support Code Changes to Dimensional Regulations for Residence Yards.

SECTION 1. **AMENDMENT:** The Village Code of the Village of Southampton is hereby amended by adding the underlined words and deleting the strikethroughs:

GREENSPACE

Any pervious land in its natural condition and/or covered with grass, shrubs, trees or other vegetation. Greenspace shall include sand, beach, dunes, tidal lands, ponds, lakes and wetland areas. Greenspace can also include a driveway constructed using green pavers which allow for the growth of vegetation. It does not include any impervious surfaces such as buildings, decks, porches, driveways, parking areas, patios, pools, playing courts, asphalt or highly compacted gravel.

STORY, HALF

A story with at least two opposite exterior sides meeting a sloping roof not more than two feet above the floor of such story and having a ceiling height of at least $7 \frac{1}{2}$ feet over not more than 1/2 the total floor area.

SECTION 2. AUTHORITY

The proposed Local Law is enacted pursuant to NYS Village Law 7-700, as well as Municipal Home Rule Law §10(1)(ii)(a)(11) and (12).

SECTION 3. APPLICABILITY

The proposed Local Law shall not apply to any application which was made and is pending or in the approval process as of the effective date of the law.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this Local Law, or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance shall be judged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect or impair or invalidate the remainer thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this Local Law, or in its application to the person, individual, firm, or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to Municipal Home Rule.
