PLEASE OBSERVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING LOCAL LAWS WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE

1. Each local law shall be filed with the Secretary of State within 20 days after its final adoption or approval as required by section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law. The cited statute provides that a local law shall not become effective before it is filed in the office of the Secretary of State.
2. Each local law to be filed with the Secretary of State shall be an original certified copy.
3. Each local law shall be filed on a form provided by the Department of State. If additional pages are required, they must be the same size as the form. Typewritten copies of the text may be attached to the form. Only legible copies will be accepted.
4. File only the number, title and text of the local law.
5. In the case of a local law amending a previously enacted local law, the text must be that of the law as amended. Do not include any matter in brackets, with a line through it, italicized or underscored to indicate the changes made. The printed number of the bill and explanatory matter must be omitted.
6. For the purpose of filing a local law with the Department of State, number each local law consecutively, beginning with the number one for the first local law filed in each calendar year. The next number in sequence should be applied to each local law when it is submitted for filing, regardless of its date of introduction or adoption. The date of filing of a local law is the date on which the local law is placed on file by the Department.

It is suggested that municipalities use introductory identifying bill numbers for proposed local laws. After the local law is enacted (and approved by the voters, if required), the local law should then be numbered with the next consecutive local law number, as described above, and then submitted to the Department for filing.

7. Each copy of a local law filed with the Secretary of State shall have affixed to it a certification by the Clerk of the County legislative body or the City, Town or Village Clerk or other officer designated by the local legislative body. Certification forms are provided herewith.



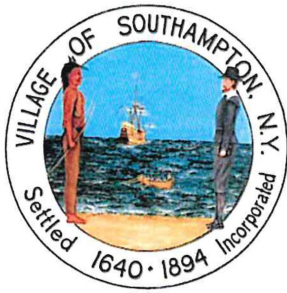

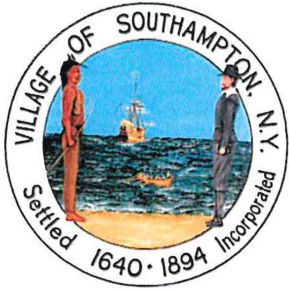

**NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 82-7
OF THE VILLAGE CODE (GENERAL PEACE AND GOOD ORDER;
BICYCLES ON STREETS; VEHICLES ON SIDEWALKS; SKATING) BY
ADDING ELECTRIC ASSIST BICYCLES AND ELECTRIC SCOOTERS**

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Southampton is considering “A Local Law amending Chapter 82-7 of The Village Code (General Peace And Good Order; Bicycles On Streets; Vehicles on Sidewalks; Skating) By Adding Electric Assist Bicycles and Electric Scooters;” and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Village Board on July 11, 2024, at which time all persons either for or against said amendment were heard; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 22 of 2024 is hereby adopted as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 22 OF 2024

A Local Law amending 82-7 of The Village Code (General Peace And Good Order; Bicycles On Streets; Vehicles on Sidewalks; Skating) By Adding Electric Assist Bicycles and Electric Scooters.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT The Village Code of the Village of Southampton is hereby amended by adding the underlined words as follows:

§ 82-7 **Bicycles on streets; vehicles on sidewalks; skating.**

A. No person shall operate any tricycle, ~~or~~ bicycle, bicycle with electric assist as defined in NYS Vehicle & Traffic Law, or an electric scooter as defined in NYS Vehicle & Traffic Law between the curblines of the following streets, that is, in that portion thereof normally devoted to the parking and operation of motor vehicles:

- (1) On Main Street from the northerly lines of Meeting House Lane and Jobs Lane to the southerly lines of Hampton Road and Nugent Street.
- (2) On Jobs Lane from Main Street to the entrance to the Village parking area south of Jobs Lane.
- (3) On Hampton Road from Main Street to Little Plains Road.


B. No person shall drive or operate any bicycle or motor vehicle of any kind or nature along the public sidewalks or footpaths of the Village of Southampton within the area described as the VB Business District in Chapter 116, Zoning, of the Code of the Village of Southampton, as amended.

C. No person shall ride on, use or operate any skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, roller blades or similar device upon any streets, sidewalks, parking area or public place in the Village of Southampton within the area designated as the VB Business District in Chapter 116, Zoning, of the Code of the Village of Southampton, as amended, except at a place or places, if any, which may be specifically designated for such use. No person shall ride on, use or operate any skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, roller blades or similar device upon any of the following streets (including the entire width thereof, including the paved or improved portion thereof normally devoted to the operation and parking of motor vehicles and the portion thereof normally devoted to pedestrian traffic, including sidewalks): Culver Street: Pond Lane.

D. Reckless operating shall mean operating, using or riding on any bicycle, skateboard, roller skates, in-line skates, roller blades or similar device upon any public street in the Village of Southampton in a manner which unreasonably interferes with the free and proper use of the public street or unreasonably endangers users of the public street. Reckless operating is prohibited.
