ORDINANCE NO. 1301

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SPRINGDALE, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 460, § 460-55 TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL NO PARKING ON PORTER STREET; AMENDING CHAPTER 460, § 460-36 TO FURTHER RESTRICT THE PARKING OF TRAILERS AND OTHER CERTAIN VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT ON BOROUGH STREETS; AMENDING CHAPTER 460, § 460-47 TO SET THE SPEED LIMIT ON DUQUESNE COURT; TO CREATE BUSINESS PARKING ONLY ZONE ON PITTSBURGH STREET AND TEN MINUTE PARKING LOCATIONS IN THE BUSINESS DISTRICT AND AUTHORIZING THE PAINTING OF CURBS ON PITTSBURGH STREET.

WHEREAS, on September 6, 1994, Springdale Borough Council enacted Ordinance 1168 regulating traffic and parking on streets, highways and public parking lots within the Borough, which is codified in the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale at Chapter 460 of the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale; and

WHEREAS, those portions of roadways that are designated as no parking at all times are set forth in Schedule I attached to said Ordinance and Codified in the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale at Chapter 460, § 460-55; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council desires to restrict parking westbound on Porter Street from Pittsburgh Street the entire length, adding same to Ordinance 1168 Schedule I as codified in the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale at Chapter 460-36; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council desires to amend Ordinance 1168 Schedule A, as codified in the Codified Ordinances of Springdale Borough at Chapter 460, 460, § 460-47 to set the speed limit on Duquesne Court at ten (10) miles per hour;

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2017, Springdale Borough Council enacted Ordinance 1250, amending Ordinance 1168, which is codified at Chapter 460, § 460-36 of the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale to restrict the parking of trailers on any public street, alley or right of way; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council has determined that Emergency Vehicles such as Ambulances, Firetrucks, and the like continue to be inhibited and delayed due to parking of trailers and other large vehicles on such roadways and that further restriction is warranted to provide the safest, quickest response possible; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council desires to create a business only parking zone on Pittsburgh Street traveling North between James Street and Walters Lane and two (2) ten minute parking spaces on Pittsburgh Street and authorize the painting of the curbs next to the ten minute spaces and the business parking areas along Pittsburgh Street and to limit overnight parking in Borough parking lots by permit only; and

authorizes one (1) ten minute parking space in front of 835 Pittsburgh Street and one (1) ten minute parking space in front of 823 Pittsburgh Street. Public works is authorized to paint the curbs next to the business parking zone and the ten minute parking spaces purple and to erect any appropriate signage for same.

SECTION V. § 460-35 OVERNIGHT PARKING RETITLED AND REVISED.

§ 460-35 is hereby retitled and revised to read as follows:

§ 460-35 Overnight parking by permit only for residential tenants.

Borough Council hereby restrict overnight parking in Borough owned parking lots to permit parking only for residential tenants. Any tenant who desires a permit to park in either Borough lot must apply for same in person at the Borough Office using an application supplied by the Borough. The permit shall be for three month periods and may be renewed every three months. Permits are for passenger vehicles only. No construction vehicles, commercial vehicles, trailers, etc. The initial permit fee is twenty \$20.00. In addition to any other information required on the application, each tenant applying shall provide a valid driver's license, a valid vehicle registration and a current lease in effect at the time of the application. The addresses on the license/ID and registration must match the address on the lease. Public Works is hereby authorized to erect appropriate signage in the Borough parking lots to notify the public of these restrictions.

SECTION VI. § 460-37 VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES REVISED.

§ 460-37 Violations and penalties is hereby revised to read as follows:

Penalties for violating any of the provisions of Article IV of this chapter shall be a fine of \$25.

Failure to pay the citation to the Borough within seventy-two-hour time period will lead to the filing of charges at the local Magisterial District Judge, and additional fines of not less than \$300 not more than \$500 shall be imposed upon conviction, together with any other court costs and filing fees incurred and including the additional assessment of reasonable attorneys' fees incurred.

Any police officer of the Borough of Springdale may remove or cause to be removed to a place of safety any vehicle which is parked in violation of Article IV of this chapter.

VII. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate and distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Springdale Borough Council, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION I. NO PARKING ON PORTER STREET

Parking of any vehicle is hereby prohibited on Porter street from the intersection of Pittsburgh street traveling East the remaining length toward the river. Schedule I of Ordinance 1168, now codified in the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale as Chapter 460, § 460-55 Schedule I: No-Parking Areas is hereby amended to include the following:

<u>Name of Street</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Location</u>
Porter Street	East	From Pittsburgh Street the remaining length.

SECTION II. § 460-36 TRAILER PARKING RETITLED AND REVISED.

§ 460-36 is hereby retitled and revised to read as follows:

§ 460-36 Trailer, equipment and other vehicle restrictions.

It shall be unlawful to park, deposit or leave any of the following on any public property, street, alley, right of way, curb or sidewalk within the Borough, including sidewalks across driveways: dual wheeled vehicles, vehicles greater than 7ft wide, vehicles with more than two axles, detached snowplows or other similar equipment.

It is further unlawful to park any motorhome, camper or trailer regardless of size, type, or intended use, on any public property, street, alley or right-of-way, unless it is properly attached to a vehicle suitable for the safe towing of said trailer; and then only for the express purpose of loading and/or unloading of said motorhome, camper or trailer and not for a period of time in excess of two hours and provided that the owner of said motorhome, camper or trailer is present and able to move same in the event of an emergency.

SECTION III. DUQUESNE COURT SPEED LIMIT.

Borough Council hereby amends Ordinance 1168 to set the speed limit on Duquesne Court at ten (10) miles per hour Schedule A of Ordinance 1168, now codified in the Codified Ordinances of the Borough of Springdale as Chapter 460, § 460-47 Schedule A: Speed Limits is hereby amended to include the following:

<u>Name of Street</u>	<u>Speed Limit</u>	<u>Location</u>
Duquesne Court	25 m.p.h.	Entire length within Borough

SECTION IV. ADDITIONAL PITTSBURGH STREET PARKING RESTRICTIONS.

Borough Council hereby authorizes and enacts a business parking zone from James Street to Walters Lane from 8 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. with no overnight parking permitted; Council further

SECTION VIII. REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.


SECTION IX. EFFECTIVE DATE.


