# **ORDINANCE # 2024-005**

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 286 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WALLINGTON TO REVISE THE RESIDENT PARKING PROGRAM.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington as follows:

Section 2 of Chapter 286 of the Code is amended and supplemented to read as follows:

## § 286-2 Resident parking program.

A. A resident parking program shall be instituted as follows. During certain hours, the streets of the Borough of Wallington will be designated "Resident Parking Only" for the following streets or parts of streets:

Johnson between Alden & Miller Alden between Lackawanna and Mount Pleasant Spring Court Spring Street between Mount Pleasant and Lackawanna.

B. Rules and regulations. The following rules and regulations shall apply to the Borough of Wallington Resident Permit Parking Program:

(1) A resident parking permit placard of a design specified by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington will be issued to residents of Wallington who own a motor vehicle which is not excluded form eligibility by this Chapter.

(2) The following vehicles re ineligible for a Resident Parking Permit:

- (a) vehicle designed, maintained, or used primarily for the transportation of property or for the provision of commercial services, whether or not and bearing commercial license plates.
- (3)

No resident overnight parking placard shall be issued for any of the following types of vehicles: any boat or boat trailer;

- (b) any motorhome or self-contained camper;
- (c) any camper slip-on where the back of the camper is higher than the roof line of the cab of the truck.
- (d) any mobile home, trailer or fifth wheel vehicle;
- (e) any pop-up camper/tent trailer or similar recreation oriented portable vehicle, transportable facility or conveyance.
- (f) any vehicle defined as a commercial vehicle by New Jersey law;
- (g) any vehicle, including passenger cars, vans, and trucks normally used for private purpose but painted with or carrying commercial advertising, logos, or business names;
- (h) private or public school or church buses;
- (i) any vehicle exceeding 18 feet in length and or 8 feet in width or which is more than 8000 lbs gross weight, irrespective of whether or not such vehicle would otherwise be permitted
- (j) any vehicle with any type of "for sale" sign displayed in or on the vehicle;
- (k) any vehicle which does not have a current New Jersey inspection sticker or currently registered license plate;
- (l) any vehicle which is missing any necessary parts including but not limited to tires, wheels, engine etcetera that are necessary for operation of the vehicle on public roads;
- (m) any other vehicle not defined above which is not licensed or regularly used for daily transportation including dune buggies, non-operational automobile collections or other automotive equipment not licensed for use on the roads of New Jersey;

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(3) Proof of residency of the owner of a vehicle must be presented when applying for a permit. The following is acceptable proof of residency: a copy of a valid New Jersey driver's license reflecting the vehicle owner's residency within the Borough of Wallington on the street for which the permit is sought; a copy of a valid New Jersey motor vehicle registration for the vehicle for which the permit is sought, showing the vehicle owner's address on the street for which the permit is sought in the Borough of Wallington; and one additional item reflecting the vehicle owner's residency on the street for which the permit is sought such as a deed of the property, lease or other written rental agreement. A post office box number will not be deemed proof of residency in order to receive a resident parking permit. In the case of a vehicle claimed to be leased and used by a Wallington resident, a copy of a valid motor vehicle registration and a copy of the automobile lease shall be presented to the registering agency of the Borough of Wallington resident has control over the vehicle. (4) The resident parking permit placard must be displayed in the rear window of the driver's side in the lower right-hand corner of the window.

(a) Trucks which are in the process of any delivery or pickups to a property or the identified street and any truck(s) utilized by utility companies in the State of New Jersey or their entities or any trucks that are already covered by other ordinances are exempted from the permit requirement.

(5) § 286-3 <u>Visitor permits.</u> There shall be two temporary visitor placards issued to any resident. The visitor's placard may be used for no more than a period of seven days. No more than two visitor's placards may be issued to any one address. The visitor's placard shall contain the date of issuance, the make, model and license plate number of the vehicle for which the placard is issued. The placard must be displayed, and the Police Department given prior notice of each use as required by Section 286-2.B

(6) <u>§ 286-7</u> <u>Unauthorized use, duplication, or sale of resident parking placard; violations and penalties.</u>

(a) The unauthorized making, duplicating, selling, lending or giving of any resident parking placard is hereby prohibited. This provision shall include, but is not limited to, any unauthorized duplication or use of a Borough of Wallington Resident Parking Placard.

(b) Any person violating any provision of this chapter, including incorrect display of the Resident Parking Placard, shall be subject to those a penalty of \$100. per offense. Each day in which the offense continues shall be deemed a separate offense.

(3) Proof of residency of the owner of a vehicle must be presented when applying for a permit.
