ORDINANCE NO. 1419

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF WILDWOOD CREST AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 79 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, SECTION 79-32, NO PARKING OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WILDWOOD CREST

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest has determined that it is necessary and proper for good government and the economic prosperity of the business community, the convenience and welfare of the Borough, its inhabitants and visitors to update, amend and supplement Section 79-32, Schedule I, no parking, to allow parking on the south side of Toledo Avenue from Atlantic to its easterly terminus.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, as follows: (added language is <u>underlined</u>, deleted language is <u>stricken</u>)

<u>Section 1.</u> The portion of Ordinance No. 1237 adopted May 25, 2016, that has been codified in the Code of the Borough of Wildwood Crest as Section 79-32 is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

Section 2. Section 79-32 is amended as follows:

§ 79-32. Schedule I, no parking.

In accordance with the provisions of § 79-3, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets.

Toledo Avenue	North Both	Atlantic Avenue to its easterly terminus
Louisville Avenue	$\frac{North}{}$	Atlantic Avenue to its easterly terminus
Nashville Avenue	South	Atlantic Avenue to its easterly terminus

<u>Section 3.</u> The remainder of all other sections and subsections of the aforementioned ordinance not specifically amended by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. All other ordinances in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 5. If any portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance, but shall be confined in its effect to the provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 6. This ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after final passage and advertisement thereof as required by law.
