ORDINANCE NO. 1262-23

ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 4, SECTION 1, "GENERAL BEACH AND BOARDWALK REGULATIONS", SUBSECTIONS 4-1.2 "BOARDWALK – PROHIBITED ACTS" AND 4-1.8 "BEACH – PROHIBITED ACTS" OF THE WILDWOOD CITY CODE REGARDING PUBLIC POSSESSION AND/OR CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL

WHEREAS, the City of Wildwood has determined that certain amendments to the Wildwood City Code are necessary and intends to enact said amendments as set forth herein;

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 4, "General Beach and Boardwalk Regulations", is hereby amended as follows:

- a. The following sentence shall be added to Section 4-1.2(b) as subparagraph 13: No person shall consume, possess or display any alcoholic beverage of any kind, or in any container, on the entire boardwalk at any time during the year, except in designated restaurant and/or bar areas.
- b. The following sentence shall be added to Section 4-1.8(a) as subparagraph 19: Except for a special event as permitted by the City, no person shall consume, possess or display any alcoholic beverage of any kind, or in any container, on the entire beach at any time during the year.

<u>Section 3.</u> The remainder of all other sections and subsections of the aforementioned ordinances not specifically amended by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 4.</u> All other ordinances in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 5.</u> If any portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

<u>Section 6.</u> This ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days from final passage and advertisement thereof as required by law.
