

AMENDED ORDINANCES



In a progressive move, the Board of Aldermen has approved amendments to city ordinances 92.01 and 92.20, aimed at addressing the community's stray cat population. The revised ordinances now provide clearer definitions of feral and stray cats, and have updated the Licensing Required ordinance. This change facilitates the humane capture, neutering, and return of these cats by authorized companies, which is expected to effectively manage and reduce the number of stray cats roaming the streets, thus promoting a healthier community for all residents and wildlife.




ELECTION

In a remarkable turn of events, the race for Alderman Ward One has resulted in a tie, prompting a runoff election between candidates Robert Roskowske III and Herb Crosby. The city clerk announced the decision following the deadlock in the April 2nd election.



The proclamation was made official in the meeting held on April 11th. Residents of Ward One can anticipate the publication of the official notice of election in the Elsberry Democrat and the Troy Free Press during the week of May 19th. Absentee voting is set to commence on April 23, 2024.





Eligible Ward One voters wishing to cast an absentee ballot can do so at the Lincoln County Courthouse, Room 204, located on Main Street in Troy, from 8 am to 4:30 pm. Additionally, the county clerk's office will accommodate voters on Saturday, June 1st, from 8 am to noon. The absentee voting period concludes at 5 pm on June 3rd, with all ballots required to be submitted to the County Clerk's office by 7 pm on Election Day, June 4th. The election will take place at Winfield City Hall on Harry's Way, with polls open from 6 am to 7 pm. For any inquiries, the Voter Registration Office is available at (636) 462-8090.

PLANT SALE





His specialized skills as a drug recognition expert highlight his dedication to public safety and his commitment to combating driving under the influence and drug-related offenses. As a K9 officer, he has spent over a year working closely with a trained police dog, which not only aids in narcotics detection but also strengthens community relations. Officer Brown's military background and extensive experience in law enforcement make him a

valuable asset to the Winfield Police Department and the community he serves. His passion for his work and his proactive approach to law enforcement reflect the qualities of a dedicated officer committed to maintaining safety and upholding the law. K9 Don is a 3 year old German Shepherd and is partnered with Officer Josh Brown, K9 Don has been with the Winfield Police Department since 2022 K9. Don was donated by Dogs on Duty and Dowdy Dogs donated the training. K9 Don is certified in Narcotics, Tracking, Evidence Search, Building Clearing, Handler Protection, and Criminal Apprehension by the American Man-Trailing and Police Working Dog Association. K9 Don has had 39 deployments including (4) building searches, (30) narcotics detection, (1) evidence search of a field and (4) tracking.
