

ORDINANCE 2014 -4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER, MORRIS COUNTY, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 225 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER “VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC” BY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING § 225-21 “MULTI-WAY STOP INTERSECTIONS.”

WHEREAS, municipalities are empowered to make, amend, repeal, and enforce its ordinances pursuant to Statute (N.J.S.A. 40:48-1, et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council recommend the adoption a 4 way stop intersection at the intersection of Maple Avenue and Seminary to promote traffic safety for the motoring public;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Engineer supports the recommendation for the proposed 4 way stop intersection; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chester, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Section 225-21 “Multi-way Stop Intersections” is hereby amended to include the following:

<u>Intersection</u>	<u>Stop Signs On:</u> _____
Maple Avenue and Seminary Avenue	Each corner of intersection (4 way stop)

SECTION 2. Severability. Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. Repealer. All ordinances or rules or regulations of the Borough of Chester, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.
