A Regular Meeting of the East Pennsboro Township Board of Commissioners was held on Wednesday, September 20, 2017, at 7:30 p.m. at the Community and Municipal Center, 98 S. Enola Drive, Enola, Pennsylvania.

Those present were: Commissioners – John Kuntzelman, President; Paul Hartman, Vice President; George Tyson, Kristy Magaro, and Charles Gelb; John Pietropaoli, Township Manager; Lisa M. Coyne, Esquire, Township Solicitor; John B. Owen, Codes Enforcement Officer; Jared Hockenberry, Township Engineer; Dearan Quigley, Director, Housing & Community Development; Chief Bashore and Lieutenant Mark Green, Police Department; and Erik Owen, Fire Marshal.

I. CALL TO ORDER

President Kuntzelman called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. A Moment of silent meditation was observed, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

II. BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

There was no business from the floor.

III. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL

MOTION authorizing payment of invoices and payroll pending review and signatures of Commissioners, was made by Mr. Hartman, seconded by Ms. Magaro, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to approve the time extension for the Preliminary/Final Lot Consolidation and Land Development Plan for Camp Hill Commons until October 5, 2017, to allow the Board of Commissioners to consider and vote with an additional fifteen (15) days thereafter to communicate a decision on said plan as requested by HRG in a letter dated September 15, 2017, was made by Mr. Tyson, seconded by Ms. Magaro, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to remove the Acting designation from Dearan Quigley to assume the role of Director of Housing and Community Development/Zoning Administrator, was made by Mr. Hartman, seconded by Mr. Gelb, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to direct the Township Solicitor to prepare and advertise the revised animal control ordinance, with removal of Part 3, the chicken ordinance section, was made by Ms. Magaro, seconded by Mr. Gelb, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to add Amy Graybill and Dearan Quigley as alternate Right to Know Officers for the township administration, was made by Mr. Tyson, seconded by Mr. Gelb, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to add Lieutenant Mark Green and Denise Sgrignoli as alternate Right to Know Officers for the East Pennsboro Police Department, was made by Ms. Magaro, seconded by Mr. Hartman, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to approve and execute the revised 6-month employment agreement for Chief Todd Bashore, was made by Mr. Hartman, seconded by Ms. Magaro, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

MOTION to approve the conditional offer of employment as a probationary officer with the East Pennsboro Township Police Department to Anthony Fiore, pending completion of his physical, psychological and polygraph testing, with a start date of December 6, 2017, was made by Mr. Tyson, seconded by Ms. Magaro, and was carried by a unanimous aye vote.

The board welcomed and congratulated the 2017 EPYAL baseball 10-and-Under All-Star Team.

President Kuntzelman noted the team made the township proud. Mr. Gelb congratulated Coach Comp, Coach Rafferty and Coach Foster, as well as the great group of kids and parents. He noted it was a long road and a great ride, but they are the first EPYAL team that has ever won districts and then sectionals and runner-up at States.

Coach Comp noted he also coaches the high school team and is lucky enough to coach these young men, who went through a lot of games, had a lot of pressure on themselves, but handled themselves well and represented the community in a great way. They received a lot of support from EPYAL with some different funding for the traveling expenses where they were in a hotel for the State tournament for just over a week. He stated this team has a goal to play with the 12-year-olds in Williamsport in a couple of years, and this is a stepping stone in that direction.
