Re: Easement Agreements

July 17, 2007

You have asked my opinion regarding several issues concerning the approval and issuance of easements for activities encroaching into the city's right-of-way.

Sign easements are handled in two offices: Through the zoning office and the engineering bureau. The zoning office makes an initial determination as to the appropriateness of a sign in any of the various zoning classifications in terms of size and height from the ground. Section 303 of the c\City Zoning Code specifies the size dimensions for signage in the different classifications. The only content regulation for signage pertains to limited sign advertising to "the occupant's commercial industry or products made on the premises."

Thereafter, if it appears that a sign encroaches into a right-of-way, the owner is directed to the Bureau of Engineering to obtain an easement. The Engineering Office examines a rendering of the sign to be assured that the encroachment does not hinder pedestrian traffic. Engineering requires at least ten feet of clearance from the bottom portion of the sign to the sidewalk with no restriction as far as projection over the walkway. The City also requires a certificate of insurance from the owner in an amount not less than \$500,000.00 naming the City of Erie an additional insured. After City Council approves the easement, the owner is required to procure a building permit.

The City Code officials follow their criteria and are in no way bound by the "guidelines" announced by the Downtown Improvement District.

For other encroachments, the Engineering Bureau is consulted and a building permit may be required if an accessibility issue is involved but, obviously, the Section 303 sign requirements do not come into play. Otherwise Engineering requires a minimum of six feet clearance between the encroachment and the curb or four feet between the encroachment and any other obstruction in the right-of-way. To Whom It May Concern:

We are appealing to you for assistance in making French Street safer to cross for our staff and customers. The PA CareerLink, Eire County, is located in Lovell Place at 1309 French Street. Our office is situated on French Street where motorists speed between the traffic light at East 12<sup>th</sup> Street and the next stop at East 18<sup>th</sup> Street. The CareerLink, is home to 60 staff and an average of 175 customers per day - many of who are seniors. They must cross French Street from the parking lots to access the building.

While a stop sign might not be the appropriate means of controlling the speeding traffic, perhaps the installation of a crosswalk/crosswalk sign would be an effective way of slowing/stopping traffic.

Enclosed is information on free crosswalk signs that are available to municipalities through PennDOT as well as information on the effectiveness of crosswalk signs in helping to increase pedestrian safety.

CITY OF ERIE. ERIE COUNTY LIQUID FULES TAX FUND BACKGROUND  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2005

The Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law, title 72 P. S. 2615.5, provides municipalities other than counties (townships, boroughs, cities, towns, home rule and optional plan governments) with an annual allocation of liquid fuel taxes from the state's Motor License Fund to be used for the maintenance and repair of streets roads and bridges for which the municipality is responsible. The allocation of these funds to municipalities is based: (1) 50 percent on the municipality's proportion for local road mileage to the total local road mileage in the state, and (2) 50 percent on the proportion of a municipality's population to the total population in the state.

The Vehicle Code, Title 75 P. S. 9511, provides municipalities with annual maintenance payments to be received from the Motor License Fund for functionally local highways that were transferred to a municipality from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Each Municipality must deposit the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money and annual maintenance payments that it receives into a special fund called the Municipal Liquid Fuels Tax Fund or State Fund. A municipality may not deposit any other monies into this fund except when the municipality does not have enough money in the special fund to meet the payments called for by its current annual budget for road and bridge purposes. In this case, the municipality may borrow money or transfer money from its General Fund to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The Department of Transportation has been given the regulatory authority for the administration of these funds. To qualify for its annual allocation, each municipality shall submit the following documents and information the Department of Transportation.

1. Evidence that the treasurer is bonded in accordance with the law, or that its treasurer is a bank requiring on bond by January 31 of each year.
2. A report indicating the manner in which its liquid fuels tax allocation was expended in the previous year (Form MS-965) by January 31 of each year.
3. A report of elected and appointed officials by January 31 of each year.
4. A Survey of financial Condition by March 15 of each year.

Department of Transportation Publication 9 contains the policies and procedures that govern the use of Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money. However, if there is a difference between Publication 9 and any legislation, the legislation shall govern.
