Overview of Erie's Economy

Erie's economy continues to follow the trends of past recessions, but not as severely
as has been the case in the past. The "trend" is that Erie rolls into the recession
behind the national and state economy and then trails it coming out of the recession.
While this particular recession has historical significant for the country, from a
relative stand-point, Erie has weathered this recession better than past recessions.
Unemployment, while very high, is within a 1/2 point of national unemployment while in
the past it has been several points above that national average.

While the loss of jobs through the recent announcements by Steris and Plastek are
disturbing to hear, it is important to note they were decisions driven by corporate
strategy focused on better service to customers. In both cases, there was nothing - or
very little - the region could do to head those announcements off. On the positive side
- KDI and GE both have provided positive job news. Mazany furniture just opened up an
operation in downtown Erie, Owens Illinois decided to remain in Erie and grow their
operation here.

Concerns for the long-term are our real estate market, workforce preparedness, need
for more rail sidings, need for greater use of internet by existing manufacturing base as
a sales and marketing tool, lack of economic development strategy at the state level and
severe cutbacks to business assistance programs at the state level.

Overview of Activity

Business Retention & Expansion Program (BREP) continues to function in Erie County
despite a 67% cut in funding from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

BREP will meet with 400-500 companies in CY 2010.

BREP's biggest challenge is getting candid input regarding challenges that business
faces. The more candid the input from businesses, the more aggressive we can be in
aligning programs and resources from throughout the region to help them address their
challenges.

Workforce Development (WD) Specialists continue to proactively connect companies to
available training dollars. Last fiscal year, over \$1 million of training funds were
secured for over 80 Erie County companies.

WD Specialists and ERCGP helped secure support from the Northwest Industrial
Resource Center (IRC) to undertake a value stream mapping process within the Erie
CareerLink in an effort to improve services to employees and employers.

Tap Into Erie (TIE) has generated over 20 prospects who are looking for locations
to grow their business. These prospects include craft brewers, cellulosic ethanol
producers, biodiesel operators, datacenter, manufacturers, grocery stores and food
processors. To get to these 20 prospect visits, over 3500 calls were made. No prospects
have made a commitment to Erie at this time, but dialogues continue. (NOTE: The business
attraction "sales cycle" is 18-24 months of lead time and dialogue.)

Tap into Manufacturing was launched in February 2010 to market the regions
collective manufacturing capabilities. This initiative is designed to attract orders to
existing companies, entice companies to locate here based upon our vibrant supply chain,
and increase the volume of business-to-business activity.

Lead Economic Development Team continues to meet twice a month. The first meeting
of the month is focused on "tactical" issues - discussing and addressing the needs of
specific companies. The second meeting of the month is focused on "strategic" issues -
new initiatives that can help improve the overall business climate and create more
investment activity in Erie.

Other Business

- **Inland Port project** being lead by the Economic Development Corporation of Erie County is moving forward and holds great promise for the region as a "new" industrial segment with great job producing potential.
- **Great Lakes Wind Energy** may be an area of opportunity for GE, Western Pennsylvania's supply chain of manufacturers, and Port activity. A large-scale windmill has nearly 8000 component parts. Off-shore windmills in the Great Lakes may begin to be considered more seriously in light of recent approval of an off-shore wind farm off the cost of Cape Cod.
- **Software Writing** in-sourcing is now underway in Erie. This project is a collaborative initiative involving GE, Penn State, Oracle and Paradigm Information Technologies. While in its early stages, it has the potential to build another industrial segment that is underrepresented in the region - software writing.
- **Enterprise Development Fund's** conversion to a formal community development financial institution - and the subsequent funding of that CDFI by a variety of sources (public and private) has brought a wonderful new financing tool to the region for use by existing companies and new, entrepreneurial start-ups. This new tool is a great complement to existing revolving loan funds and our wonderful privately owners financial institutions.
- **Gannon University's Technology Incubator** is growing both inside and outside its walls. This new program and facility has provided focus and direction to a number of our region's technology start-ups. The Tech incubator is enabling our region to cultivate new, technology start-ups in an unprecedented manner - many of who have great promise to bring both new wealth creation and jobs to the region.

The City Planning Commission reviewed the proposal of Anthony Walden, 1405 Reed Street and his neighbors to close and vacate the alley between 14th and 15th Streets east of Reed Street.

This alley is only grass and no one has used it as a transportation right-of-way for at least forty years. It is fifteen feet wide and the property owners would like to close it for a length of 202.5 feet along its northern border and 211.5 feet along its southern border, with a southeasterly diagonal line connecting these points. Upon closing, the alley would get added as additional backyard space for the abutting owners and be maintained as such. Additionally, the Commission Secretary notified all necessary

public utilities and relevant city departments of the proposal and none had any objections or concerns.

By unanimous vote, the City Planning Commission recommends closing and vacating the alley in the manner proposed by Mr. Walden and his neighbor.

Resolution for funding of Erie Enterprise Zone: The Grant Contract referenced above provides a portion of the funding of our Erie Enterprise Zone. The funding received through this contract pays part of the salary of the zone coordinator, who provides loan and technical assistant to clients in the zone. The balance of our zone funding, which is obtained from our revolving loan fund interest and investment income is used to pay the balance of that salary along with the administrative costs.

The grant funding comes from the PA Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) through the State's New Communities Program. Under the program parameters, which are set for our State designated enterprise zone, we can request funding of up to \$50,000 for the operation of our zone annually during the life of the zone, which is in effect until June 30, 2011. In order to request funding for the upcoming fiscal Year of July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011, we need a resolution authorizing the submission of an amendment for our present contract with the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.

Therefore, we respectfully request that City Council authorize the attached resolution so we can request continued assistance from the Pa Department of Community and Economic Development through their New Communities Program. Please note that this is our last opportunity to obtain DCED assistance under the current Enterprise setup.

Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to extend financial assistance to grantees and nonprofit agencies which provide essential services, operations, homeless prevention and shelter rehabilitation for homeless persons, and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Department of HUD has advised the City the FY2010 Entitlement are as follows: CDBG, \$3,824,080; HOME, \$1,075,222 and ESG \$154,918; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the entitlement funds, the City expects to receive \$10,000 in program income, and \$334,134 in reprogramming funds; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Economic and Community Development of the City of Erie has prepared a five-year Consolidated Plan for 2010-2014 and an Annual Plan for the FY 2010 funding year which assesses the housing needs of low and moderate income households, homeless families and individuals, and others with special needs; and

WHEREAS, the draft Five-Year Consolidated Plan for FY2010-2014 and Annual Plan for FY2010 was on public display since March 22, 2010 and the city held two (2) Public Hearings on said Annual Plan and the Comments of various agencies, groups and citizens were taken into consideration in the preparation of the final documents; and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Erie, Pennsylvania and it is hereby resolved by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1: That the Five Year Consolidated Plan for FY 2010-2014 and Annual Plan for the FY 2010, CDBG, HOME and ESG Program is hereby in all respects approved and the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a copy of said Five-Year Consolidated Plan and Annual Plan with the minutes of this meeting.

Section 2: That it is cognizant of the conditions that are imposed in undertaking and carrying out of community development, affordable housing and emergency homeless activities with federal financial assistance, including those relating to (1) the relocation of site occupants, (b) the prohibition of discrimination because of race, color, age, religion, sex, disability, family status, or national origin and other assurances as set forth under the certifications.

Section 3: That the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Erie, is authorized to file an application for financial assistance with the U. S. Department of HUD which has indicated its willingness to make available a grant to carry out the CDBG Program in the amount of \$3,824,080, HOME in the amount of \$1,075,222, and ESG in the amount of \$154,918 and is further authorized to act as an authorized representative of the City of Erie to sign any and all documents in regard to these programs.

Section 4: That the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Erie, Pennsylvania, is authorized to provide assurances and/or certifications as required by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as Amended, the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, and the Steward B. McKinney Homeless assistance act, and also any supplemental or revised data which the U. S. Department of HUD may request in connection with the review of this application.

On April 14, 2010, our EZ Loan Review Committee acted favorably on the loan proposal listed below. Therefore, we have prepared the attached resolution, which request ratification of the approval at the City Council meeting scheduled for Wednesday, May 5, 2010.

Professional Building Condominium Association, 1611 Peach Street, Erie, Pa., (Paul Carpenedo, President, Carl Martz, VP & David Schlaudecker, Treasurer: Our Loan Review Committee approved a \$250,000 Enterprise Zone Revolving Loan fund proposal to assist the Professional Building Condominium Association with a facade renovation of this facility. This project abuts the Mayor's downtown revitalization initiative, which is just to the north on both Peach and State Streets. This project, which is located in our Erie Enterprise Zone, has high visibility and it benefits the immediate area directly and our community as a whole. A renovated Professional Building is a welcoming anchor to Erie-downtown business/entertainment district.

We will provide a \$250,000 EZRLF Loan for up to 15 years at 4.0% per annum, which will be used in conjunction with \$100,000 of Bank Financing to complete the facade renovation. Please note that the Bank that does provide the financing is also going to restructure \$305,000 of existing debt for the association. Along with the refinancing \$150,044 will be used to buyout the ground-lease, which is presently owned by the Erie Redevelopment Authority. The Bank portion of the \$832,044 total financing package will be \$582,044. We will have a second mortgage lien on the land on which the condominium is located and our loan papers will be structured in such a way to secure payment of this obligation by the various condominium owners in accord with condominium law. The underlying land of the Professional Building appraised for \$1,350,000 in October 2009. As the association has presented their financing request to three banks, we will not fund our loan until a final commitment is in place. In other words, our commitment is contingent upon the bank financing also being in place.

The various businesses located in this condominium presently employ 75 people in family sustaining jobs and they anticipate that ten (10) new positions will be added within two years.

We look forward to City Council's ratification of this request. If you have any questions, please direct them to my attention at 870-1272.

Appearing on the City Council Agenda for May 5th is a transfer for \$50,000 to cover the cost of repair work to the drift catcher on Mill Creek at the Zoo. The repair work to be completed is mandated by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. The deficiency in the drift catcher structure was identified during their dam inspection process in 2006. Though the expected costs for this project were placed in the 2010 Budget, they are approximately \$60,000 short of the needed amount. The project was actually advertised and bids received twice in hopes of lowering the project costs. Even though the bids did drop by \$200,000 the amount available is still under funded. The funds will be transferred from the 07-0773-0000-4078 Machinery & Equipment Account and the 07-0773-0000-4056 Repair and Maintenance Services Account into the 07-0773-0000-4077 Other Improvements Account.
