AMALIA MARION VANNESS YOUNG

WHEREAS, Amalia Marion VanNess Young, of Livingston, New Jersey, is being remembered upon her passing from this life on Tuesday, April 28, 2020, at the age of 95 of complications from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Amalia Marion VanNess Young, affectionately called "Mali" by friends and family, was born in Irvington, New Jersey, and graduated from Irvington High School; and

WHEREAS, Amalia Marion VanNess Young was employed as a secretary for Prudential Insurance Company, Ciba Pharmaceuticals, and Elastic Stop Nut during World War II. She married Stanley C. Young of Oklahoma City in 1948 in Newark, New Jersey, after a three-year romance which began from a chance meeting in Louisiana where Stanley was stationed during the war; and

WHEREAS, after moving to Oklahoma, Amalia Marion VanNess Young, worked at Tinker Air Force Base until the birth of their first child. Soon afterwards, the family moved to New Jersey, living in Irvington and Westfield, before permanently settling down in Livingston in 1957; and

WHEREAS, Amalia Marion VanNess Young spent her last years at Inglemoor Care Center in Livingston, less than a mile away from her home of 50 years. She was able to see and talk with her children at a distance and remotely with help from staff during her last days; and

WHEREAS, Amalia Marion VanNess Young leaves her three children Ralph and wife, Suzanne, of Maryland, Randi of Randolph, New Jersey, and Amy and husband, William DiBartolo, of East Hanover, New Jersey; her six grandchildren Christopher, Terrence and Graham Young, all of Maryland, Adam Young of Bloomfield, New Jersey, William DiBartolo Jr., of Bridgewater, New Jersey, and Amanda DiBartolo Tedeschi of Gladstone, New Jersey; as well as their significant others, Jess, Cori, Diane, Chrissie and Phil. She leaves behind eight beloved great-grandchildren Flynn, Elliott, Hollis, Fraser, Laurel, Samantha, Thomas and Emma; her dear nine nieces and nephews; as well as her sister-in-law, June Brown of California. She was predeceased by her husband of 55 years, Stanley; her two brothers, Wallace and Robert VanNess, and her dear nephew, Thomas VanNess; now, therefore, be it
