### STATEMENTS AND COMMENTS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Nick Maggi (6 Ewington Avenue) mentioned the recent heavy rain and flooding; his street floods and his driveway turns into a river. Mr. Maggi wanted to know if anything is going to be done about it.

The Administrator responded that he is familiar with the situation on Ewington. The Township Engineer has been going around checking to see if storm drains were cleaned out. That was not the problem - your area not only has small water pipes, but small storm drains as well. It is being looked at by our Engineer for recommendations.

Mr. Maggi then explained how the storm drainage path runs through his property.

Mr. Maggi stated that blocked storm drains do not help the situation and asked if we still have a street sweeper as he had not seen it in a long time.

The Administrator and President Hyser responded – yes.

Mr. Maggi then asked if anything was being done about the water main realigning/replacing.

The Administrator responded that he has met with Trenton Water Works and if it was not for the water main collapse that occurred, Ewington was next on the list.

The Administrator stated that the Mayor has had direct conversations with Trenton Water telling them that they have to pay more attention to Ewing. Trenton Water has been paying more attention in the past six or seven months; we will not stop pressuring them.

The Administrator and Mr. Maggi then discussed what a four inch realignment would mean for his situation and the timeframe involved. The Administrator stated that he will get a clear answer from Trenton Water.

There were no further questions or comments from the Public.

**ORDINANCE(S) FOR FIRST READING AND INTRODUCTION**

1. The Clerk read (**Ordinance #13-30**) AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EWING IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER, CHAPTER 342 TAXICABS AND LIMOUSINES (2013)

Mr. Schroth then moved the Ordinance, seconded by Mr. Baxter. President Hyser stated that we had a lengthy discussion about this last night. There were no questions from Council.

The Mayor discussed the results of his meeting with the Director of Transportation, Aaron Watson. The County is going to make arrangements for taxi cabs to park on the ring road; it is still being determined as to the number of spaces. Also, the County will post a sign with all the fees passengers will incur including flat fees.

President Hyser asked the Mayor if he had an opportunity to express to Mr. Watson some of the sentiments members of Council had regarding the taxi stand.

The Mayor responded that he did have the opportunity. The Mayor believed that the situation concerned the amount of room regarding the number of taxi cabs at the stand. He does not believe that will happen, however, there will be some sort of accommodation - a number of spots at the stand and the taxis can wait in another area. The number will not be known until the County gets all of its engineering done.

President Hyser mentioned that last night there was some confusion about paying for parking.

The Mayor responded that the place where taxis are currently parking will become a paid parking lot. Taxi cabs will not have to park in that new paid parking lot; there will be a bypass road where taxi cabs can wait.

President Hyser then informed members of the public that the next meeting of the Board of County Freeholders will be July 23<sup>rd</sup> and July 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. at the County Administration Building.

Willie Hemingway (United Cab Company-1461 West State Street) said that he is concerned about how cabs wait at the airport. He knows there is a law against solicitation. Mr. Hemingway wants the Township to allow taxi cab drivers to sit under the trees as it could be a health issue as it gets hot sitting in the cabs.

President Hyser responded that this question should be directed to the County as the airport is County property and she then provided the information regarding the next Freeholder Meeting.

Samuel Page (Satchel Page Limo Company-220 Rosedale Avenue) asked if the Township could come up with a better system for transportation at the airport for late night delayed flights. He is on the taxi cab list. Passengers call him all the time; he cannot handle all the calls and he is concerned about the reputation Ewing is getting concerning passengers being stranded at the airport after a delayed flight.

President Hyser, The Attorney, The Administrator, The Mayor and Mr. Page discussed the situation.

The Administrator stated that he would meet with Mr. Page and other cab drivers to discuss recommendations to the County.

The Mayor added that a solution that could be presented to the County is the same solution as for our towing service. You sign up for a particular night; you are responsible to be there that night.

Willie Hemingway (United Cab Company-1461 West State Street) stated that he agreed with Mr. Page and suggested that you might need something to draw passengers' attention, some sort of signage, to the taxi cab list.

WHEREAS, the Planning Board is directed to provide public notice and conduct a public hearing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-6 and thereafter transmit to Township Council a report concerning its recommendation relative to the proposed Technical Amendment to the Olden Avenue Redevelopment Plan; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Ewing, in the County of Mercer, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The ETRA resolution outlining the Technical Amendment of the Olden Avenue Redevelopment Plan annexed hereto is hereby adopted subject to receipt of the report of the Planning Board pursuant to N.J.S.A. 12A:12-7(e).

Section 2. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to the portion of the Ordinance actually adjudged to be invalid, and the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall not be affected.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.

- 2. The Clerk read (Ordinance #13-27) AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EWING IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER, REVISING CHAPTER 187, FIRE PREVENTION (2013)**

WHEREAS, the Township Council desires to amend said Code Sections;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Ewing that **Chapter 187, FIRE PREVENTION**, of the Code of the Township of Ewing is hereby amended as follows:

Article 1: **Chapter 187, Uniform Fire Safety Code, § 187-2, Fire Prevention Officer** of the Code of the Township of Ewing is hereby amended as follows:

There is hereby established the Office of Fire Prevention Officer, also known as the “Fire Official.” The Fire Prevention Officer shall be appointed by the Mayor and certified in accordance with law. The Fire Prevention Officer shall be under the supervision and direction of the ~~Construction Official~~. **Business Administrator**. The Mayor may appoint such other employees as deemed necessary for local enforcing agency purposes in the Office of the Fire Prevention Officer.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication according to law.

- 3. The Clerk read (Ordinance #13-28) AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EWING, COUNTY OF MERCER, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING EWING TOWNSHIP TO OFFER A VACANT LOT KNOWN AS LOT 6, BLOCK 385 ON RAILROAD AVENUE IN EWING TOWNSHIP TO THE CONTIGUOUS LANDOWNERS BY WAY OF A PRIVATE SALE (2013)**

WHEREAS, there is an unimproved vacant lot on Rail Road Avenue, more particularly described as Lot 6 of Block 385, an irregular-shaped lot with a lot size of 1,990 square feet; and,

WHEREAS, the lot is not buildable land since the size is less than the minimum size required for development under Ewing Township's municipal zoning ordinance and the lot is without any capital improvement thereon; and,

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to abandon this unimproved vacant lots for tax purposes; and,

WHEREAS, there is one (1) contiguous landowner adjoining this vacant lot other than the Township; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5) and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13.2 permit the Township to sell the lot to contiguous landowners by way of a private sale; and,

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to offer to sell the vacant lot to the adjacent landowner to this vacant lot for not less than the fair market value of the lot, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5) and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13.2; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Township of Ewing, in the County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Ewing Township is authorized, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5) and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13.2, to sell the vacant lot, known as Lot 6 of Block 385 on Rail Road Avenue to the adjacent landowner for not less than fair market value of said real property.
2. Upon acceptance of a satisfactory agreement of sale, which shall not be for less than the fair market value of said real property, the sale of Lot 6, Block 385 may be effectuated by private sale.
3. The fair market value of Lot 6, Block 385 is not less than \$1,600.00 Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1600.00).
4. In the event that the contiguous landowner does not wish to purchase the lots, or offer the fair market value of said lots, Ewing Township is authorized to sell the lot by way of an open public sale at auction to the highest bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(a) at such time in the future as such a public sale may occur.

Section 1. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication according to law.

**STATEMENT**

This Ordinance authorizes the private sale of Lot 6, Block 385 on Rail Road Avenue.

Section 1 **CHAPTER 225, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, ARTICLE VIII Schedules, §225-52. Schedule V: Handicapped Parking on Streets**, of the Code of the Township of Ewing, is hereby amended as follows:

**§225-52. Schedule V: Handicapped Parking on Streets.**

In accordance with the provisions of § 225-9A, restricted parking spaces for use by handicapped persons with special vehicle identification cards shall be prescribed in the following locations:

The Mayor added that we are going to put the brochures into their paycheck. President Hyser stated that putting the information in an employee's paycheck would be an improvement over relying on a supervisor to distribute.

3. The Clerk read (Resolution #13R-126) A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF EWING AND THE CITY OF TRENTON FOR THE PROVISION OF NURSING SERVICES FOR LEAD-BURDENED CHILDREN
