ORDINANCE NO. 11-08

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CREATION OF A UTILITY FUND PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-62 FOR PAYMENTS TO THE EWING-LAWRENCE SEWERAGE AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Township desires to segregate and keep in a separate fund all moneys collected and applicable to the support of the Ewing-Lawrence Sewerage Authority for providing sewer services; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-62 such fund shall be known as a “utility fund.”

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Ewing that the Township desires to segregate and keep in a separate fund all moneys collected and applicable to the support of the Ewing-Lawrence Sewerage Authority for providing sewer services; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Municipal Clerk is hereby directed to forward two certified copies of this ordinance to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take affect upon approval of the Division of Local Government Services as required by law.

STATEMENT

This Ordinance authorizes the creation of a separate fund all moneys collected and applicable to the support of the Ewing-Lawrence Sewerage Authority for providing sewer services, known as a “utility fund.”
