

## **REORGANIZATION MEETING**

**January 2, 2018**

**6:30 p.m.**

Municipal Clerk Kim Macellaro called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. and introduced Mr. Charlie Geter, not only today's master of ceremonies, but former radio personality in Philadelphia and Trenton, a member of Ewing Lawrence Sewerage Authority and community activist and a very dear friend of mine to the podium for welcoming and opening remarks.

Mr. Geter welcomed everyone to Ewing Township on this very chilly evening but we will warm up your heart with a very nice political program as we reorganize this evening. He then called upon Rev. Darrell Armstrong to give the invocation. Rev. Armstrong asked everyone to stand and bow with him for the invocation. He asked for God's divine presence as this municipality takes care of its business so it can take care of your people. He thanked God for the Mayor, for members and Council, for our Township Administrator and for our Police Chief and all who ensure structure and orderliness within this great town of Ewing, New Jersey. He thanked God for its people and residents, and people from different faith traditions, races and regions. He asked for God's blessings upon them as we go throughout this year.

Mr. Charlie Geter added that Rev. Armstrong is a Ewing resident and proud father of two young men who attend Ewing Public Schools.

Mr. Geter then led all in the Flag Salute.

Charlie being Charlie – he then enlightened the crowd with this – he said that Rev. Armstrong reminded him of a Sunday Church service where the pastor got up and said, “If anyone would like to have special prayer for something that might be ailing them, please come forward.” A young man came forward. The pastor said, “young man what would you like for us to pray about?” The young man said – “it's about my hearing” to which the pastor put his finger in the young man's ear and began to pray a long prayer and finally after screaming and shouting he said, “and now young man, how is your hearing?” and the young man replied – “I don't know, it's not until next week”. (laughter)

At this time, Mr. Geter turned over the inaugural proceedings to Clerk Kim Macellaro who read the Open Public Meetings Statement.

The Clerk read Open Public Meetings Statement.

The notice requirements provided for in the “Open Public Meetings Act” have been satisfied. Notice of this Reorganization meeting was properly transmitted to the Times of Trenton and the Trentonian, filed with the Clerk of the Township of Ewing and posted in the Ewing Township Municipal Complex, all on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of December 2017.

The Clerk then announced that the Ewing Township Municipal Reorganization Meeting is now in session.

She presented the Council for the 2018 year and took the roll call.

The Clerk noted that the minutes will reflect that she now relinquishes the floor to Council President Wollert.

President Wollert announced that nominations were open for Council Vice President. Councilman David Schroth nominated Councilman Baxter and it was seconded by Councilwoman Keyes-Maloney. Hearing no questions on the motion and no further nominations, President Wollert called for a roll call.

The nomination was carried and the newly elected Vice President received the Oath of Office from the Township Clerk Kim Macellaro.

President Wollert introduced Mayor Steinmann for his comments:

Mayor Steinmann wished everyone a Happy New Year. He said that he is happy to see many friendly and familiar faces in the audience. He said it is always good to see my friend, Rev. Armstrong. He went on to say that 2017 was a mixed year to say the least. We really had some great things happening and then we had some things that weren't so great that needed to be addressed. One of the great things was that we were able to open the Hollowbrook Community Center. There is a brand-new pool and splashpad which will enhance the community. He thanked the Town Council for allowing us to get the money to make that happen. With that said, he will be back again this year for more capital bonding. One thing we are looking to do is to look at this building with another set of eyes. We are looking for an architect to see what we need to do and how we are going to do it to close it in. He said we have a short-term solution on the side of the building that we started last year with a lease for five years. He stated he doesn't want to go beyond the 5 years. He knows there will be pushback from the public, but we are growing and we are looking to enhance every department. He said he is looking forward to 2018 to make it an even better year – better service for our people. He is very much looking forward to working hand-in-glove with the Board of Education, Superintendent, Business Administrator and the School Board. He believes that the relationship couldn't be better. After all, they take a serious chunk of our tax dollars, so we need to be in line with what they are thinking and they need to be in line with my Administration and Council. He congratulated them on their school board election and knows that their Reorg will be next Monday night at Fisher, if anyone is so inclined to go. Mayor Steinmann thanked the County Administration, especially Aaron Watson, for his due diligence on Ewing Township and what the County has done for this town. He said that he has to say with honesty, that since Brian Hughes has been the County Executive, Ewing Township has always gotten top priority and he appreciates Aaron and his staff and other people in the administration for that effort. He thanked all for their support. He thanked the volunteers who serve on the boards and commissions. He thanked Bob Filler, Executive Director at ELSA for doing the job he does so well and giving us great service for a nominal amount of money. He said he looks forward to working with Councilwoman Kathy Wollert, Vice President Kevin Baxter and the rest of Council for 2018. He personally thanked Sarah

Steward, former President for her leadership and Kathy Wollert, former Vice President for her service to the community. He wished everyone again a Happy New Year! (Applause)

President Wollert also thanked everyone who took some time out to come and join us this evening. She said she knows the support is with us, not just on election day, but also after the fact and it is greatly appreciated. She said she recognizes School Board members who are here and always working with the Administration and Council looks forward to meeting with you in the very near future. She took a moment of silence for Anne Zamonsky, long-time advocate for the Democratic party, not just in this town, but in the State and the Country. President Wollert said that she is the reason she is standing here tonight. (Silence). President Wollert said that her comments are very much in line with Mayor Steinmann. We are looking to move the town forward. Her thinking is that we need to have our residents be involved and it is very difficult to get any number of people to really come together. We have wonderful commission members and wonderful committees that work very hard on specific topics, but unless there is a hot-button issue, we really don't get reaction to what we do on a day-to-day basis for our town. She asked everyone to spread the word that we really do appreciate the concern our residents have. As Tip O'Neill said many years ago – "all politics is local" and having been on Council for so many years, that quote has been brought home so many times. This year we will be seeing a lot of changes on the National Level, on the State level as we have a new Governor coming in and we are looking forward to working through all of the changes and making it work for our town in the very best way we can. She welcomed everyone and wished all a very healthy, prosperous and happy new year. She asked all for their continued support (Applause)

Vice President Baxter said that in the light of brevity he was thankful for another year on Council and thanked everyone who has always supported him. He thanked Rev. Armstrong for taking time out of his schedule to be here tonight. He preaches in Trenton, but lives in Ewing and he never lets me forget that he is a Ewing resident. He thanked Mayor Steinmann for diversity in the Township and that he listens to what he has to say. He thanked his colleagues especially outgoing President Steward who did a fabulous job last year. He stated that he is looking forward to working with now President Wollert and he knows she has a hardy agenda that she wants to get to as well as an Agenda that the Mayor wants to get to so as to keep this town moving forward. He closed by thanking his Mother and Wife for being here tonight. He wished everyone a Happy and Prosperous New Year. (Applause)

Councilwoman Steward thanked everyone for being here and how wonderful it is to see so many friends and supporters. She thanked Rev. Armstrong and Charlie Geter for leading us so ably. She also thanked her colleagues for their support during her term as Council President for the last twelve months, she said she learned a lot and saw the Township that she loves so much in a whole new light. She especially thanked Councilwoman Wollert who was by her side during my first go-round as Council President last year. She said she is confident that Kathy will lead us well this coming year. She thanked Mayor Steinmann who works tirelessly and serves our town with great distinction. She thanked the township employees for their hard work, led by our great Township Administration, Jim McManimon, and we are fortunate for your dedicated service. The Township employees of course include our first responders (Fire, Police and EMT's) both paid and volunteer who really dedicate their lives for our safety and security in the Community. She thanked the team in the Clerk's office, led by Kim and Sue, for always making the meetings run efficiently and effectively. She thanked Joanna our CFO, the Township Attorney Maeve Cannon. She thanked all that serve on Boards and Commissions for their time and dedication. Lastly, she thanked her family and friends. She commented that her parents were not there this evening but they have taught her to disagree without being disagreeable. They are also incredibly patient with my somewhat crazy life as they are waiting at the airport to be picked up by me once this is over (laughter). Every year she said it is important to take a look back and a look forward. We have accomplished a lot together this past year such as improvements to the Hollowbrook Center, the road paving projects that mean so much to our residents, service to our residents by making sure that our first responders have the support and infrastructure that they need. She said she would be remiss if she did not note that we are a community that has a Wawa, which was the most frequent question she was asked during her presidency. It was the crowning achievement during my term. She thinks that Government is what we can do better together than separately. She echoed Kathy's remarks that the residents' participation in this is important and your feedback helps us do better and be better. Please do not discount it, we welcome it and we need it. She thanked everyone for the opportunity to serve the residents of Ewing Township. (Applause)

Councilman Schroth congratulated Sarah Steward on an excellent year as our Council President and suggested “Uber” to her (laughter). Most importantly he thanked everyone for being there tonight. He said he looks forward to working with the Council with Kathy being President and Kevin being Vice President. He said they are Pro’s at this. He thanked the Mayor and Administration for what has been a great year and looks forward to continuing progress in the Township. He is excited to have broken ground at the GM site. He thanked the township employees and first responders for the amazing work they do, often times without thanks, but always thought of and appreciated. He thanked the School Board members for being there and for what they do. He looks forward to continuing his work on the Town Council. He thanked the County (Tim Watson, Art Sypek) and congratulated Art on his retirement. He wished everyone a Happy New Year and a Prosperous 2018! (Applause)

Councilwoman Keyes-Maloney said she would be as brief as possible. She said that the “geeky” part of her personality is that she loves quotes and she pulled one out from the pack that she thinks meets this august occasion. *“You are not here merely to make a living. You are here in order to enable the community to live more ably, with greater vision, with a finer spirit of hope and achievement. You are here to enrich the world, and you impoverish yourself if you forget the errand.”* She said what we do here, what Sarah did most ably, what our Mayor does, what our Administration does, what our employees do, what our first responders do, what all of us do really enriches the experience we have as a Community. She said she is proud to be a “Ewingite” because of all the citizens who care about the town we live in. She said we may not always agree or see eye-to-eye but by and large we are always rowing together. She said she is proud to serve with her fellow colleagues and with the staff and our amazing Mayor. She wished everyone a Happy New Year and looks forward to 2018! (Applause)

The Clerk turned the floor back to Charlie Geter who recognized the dignitaries.

### **RECOGNITION OF DIGNITARIES**

Mr. Geter asked if he could deviate for just a moment because he thinks this is very important, particularly to the people who live in Ewing and Lawrence. ELSA is a plant that is 60 years old. We are very proud – we have rebuilt that plant from the inside out without shutting it down, without interrupting service and without raising your sewer rates to a large, large extent. He thinks that Bob Filler, the staff and members deserve some credit for that.

Mr. Geter announced that the County Executive was here but has since left. Brian Hughes has been very diligent in helping Ewing Township and we appreciate that he came this evening. He expressed to Art Sypek that we will miss him very much, but would be happy to carry his bags and be his man servant down in Florida (laughter). Mr. Geter said that you are all very important, so if he misses anyone he apologizes. He expressed that he is very happy that we have a Mayor and Council like we do and they have been very supportive of the Boards and Commissions. He thanked Rocky Peterson (Labor Negotiator), former Councilman Joe Murphy and Don Apai and Rev. Armstrong. He introduced Sunny Muzaffar and Allen Lee from the Ewing Lawrence Sewerage Authority.
