REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

1. Report of the Health Officer – Ms. Kristin Reed, Health Officer gave her monthly report (attached) and said she quickly wanted to give highlights on the numbers relating to inspections with the retail food with 47 already completed. She continued that we now have two full time inspectors. She proceeded with the rest of the report.

OLD BUSINESS - Ms. Reed answered some questions from the last meeting and said that animal complaints in 2016-2017 were as follows: 2016 - 294 and in 2017 – 430. She said that the interesting thing is that when she asked the animal control officers if there was a difference in the year, they thought there actually wasn't that much of a difference, but we are off by 130 but we do have two individuals now so that work load was spread out between them. She said that Council also asked about immunizations. She explained that there is the number of immunizations given and the number of people immunized. So, you may have one individual that has a couple of immunizations given in one day. She reported both numbers: 2016 number of immunizations given was 1,163 and in 2017 - 1,073. Then the number of people immunized in 2016 was 1,055 and in 2017 – 970. She said Council asked about deer removal. The animal control officers are keeping a log list. They are also riding by to make sure the animal has been removed within 24/48 hours. The ACO's didn't indicate that there is a concern with response time.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Reed said that she is reporting light on the new business due to it being the beginning of the year. She said they have implemented the Health Plan Review document which they are still trial running. There are things that need to be updated. When a facility or individual comes in to open up a new restaurant, it streamlines the process for them. We also want to do one for pool plan reviews and any other ones that may be coming up. It provides the potential new owner with some good information.

She said that with regard to Trenton Water Works she really hasn't heard anything new but thinks they are moving along with DEP and trying to reach compliance with them. We will provide public notification as new information comes along. Mr. Schroth asked if there is any direct communication with the city or is it through Administration. Ms. Reed said that the Mayors are streamlining that. She said that if there is a failure, such as a boil water, or a failure with compliance perimeters, the Health Office is notified then.

Ms. Reed said that the last item deals with the TB cases which kind of reflects in the increased homes visits and they are still continuing the visits. President Wollert asked how many cases. Ms. Reed said there is one. President Wollert asked that with the flu going around, have the nurses been called out to homebound individuals. Ms. Reed said not really.


Mr. Baxter thanked her for getting back to them with the questions. He asked how many tanning salons are in the town. Ms. Reed responded that there are three. Mr. Schroth said he knew of two and asked where the third one was. Ms. Reed said she would get back to him on that. Mr. Baxter said he is awaiting an email about an autism training that they do every year for the school employees and in the community and they wanted to partner with police, emergency responders and the Health Department. Ms. Reed thanked him for including her.
