May 22, 2018 – 6:00 PM

President Wollert called the meeting to order at 6:02 pm and read the Open Public Meetings Statement:

President Wollert welcomed the Health Officer and said she is looking forward to her report.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

1. Report from the Health Officer – Ms. Kristin Reed, Health Officer gave her monthly report (attached) and went through the standard monthly numbers for April 2018.

Councilwoman Keyes-Maloney asked how many tanning salons we have and Ms. Reed responded 2 or 3. President Wollert asked about the immunizations and if they were children or adults. Ms. Reed responded that they are mostly child based.

OLD BUSINESS - Ms. Reed said that to follow up on the question about the restaurants, out of the 48 inspected, 15 of them required re-inspections and 12 were put on 12-month re-inspection list. We at a minimum have to inspect our retail food facilities once a year and some of them we wind up doing twice a year. Now that we have the extra man power we can go back again if we are concerned. We are starting to identify the ones that may need a little bit more often of an inspection. They will be on a six-month list. President Wollert asked if there are any general problem that keeps cropping up. Ms. Reed said that she went through and review all of the inspectors’ retail food inspection reports and pick out ones that are warranted of re-inspection. She is finding general sanitation and upkeep and at this time of the year refrigerators start to go and not work properly.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Reed said that on April 27th and gearing up for pools in the summer, we held a recreational code update training for all of our pool managers and operators. The Code changed and there were some significant changes for the operation of the pool. So, we really wanted to highlight some of them. The inspectors are very busy right now. This will be a rough opening and she is prepared that there may be some pools that won't be able to open when they want to open. They might not be able to comply with some of the new code requirements that the State dropped on us 2 months before pool season. President Wollert asked if there were any questions on this portion of the pool code – there were none.

Ms. Reed commented that in April there were two animal complaints. One was for a dog and the other was for an agricultural complaint. It was for a chicken. She said this is a discussion we are going to have to have further. It went back to code and they said there is no specific ordinance discussing agricultural animals. Ms. Keyes-Maloney said that this came up again a couple of years ago. She said the question becomes – below the 2 acres, do we want to allow them. Ms. Reed said that she wants to get a head of it.

Ms. Reed said that we have a lead inspection risk assessment that we are still awaiting the final results. It is possible that we may need to make some opportunities for the property owner. She further said that as soon as she gets the test results.

Just today, she continued, we have a potential communicable disease individual in the High School. We are meeting with the State Department of Health and the Board of Ed tomorrow to see how to proceed with this.

Mr. Baxter asked how long it would be to get the test results of the lead test. Ms. Reed said a couple of days.

Ms. Steward asked if there is anything more she can share about the individual at the High School. Ms. Reed said not at this time. Ms. Keyes-Maloney said that there are policies under the Board of Ed and it is up to the School Board to take the lead on this. Ms. Reed said that they will determine how they will disseminate the information and who needs to receive this information. We are just there to ensure that it is getting done.


President Wollert asked if there were any more questions. There were none and she thanked Kristin for her report.


