A Resolution appointing Ms. Tanya A. Dierolf to serve on the Environmental Advisory Council (EAC).

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 6-2018, the Environmental Advisory Council ("EAC") was reorganized in order to better carry out the mission of providing information and a forum for discussing environmental issues impacting the City of Harrisburg; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-509.2 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Harrisburg, the EAC shall be comprised of (7) seven volunteer members, of which three (3) are appointed by the Mayor and four (4) are appointed by City Council; and

WHEREAS, EAC members must be residents of the City of Harrisburg; and

WHEREAS, EAC members are appointed to serve a term of three years unless otherwise removed; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf has been nominated as one of the City Council appointments to the EAC; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf is a resident of the City of Harrisburg; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf 's qualifications to serve on the EAC have been carefully reviewed and considered by City Council. A redacted copy of Ms. Dierolf 's resume is attached and incorporated as "Exhibit A;" and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf earned her Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Environmental Studies/Science and Public Policy from Juniata College and her Master's of Science (M.S.) degree in Environmental Studies from Antioch New England Graduate School; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf 's work history shows a dedication to environmental advocacy, outreach and engagement as the former Director of Outreach of Citizen's for Pennsylvania's Future (PennFuture) in the City of Harrisburg, and as a former Field Manager for Choose Clean Water Coalition/National Wildlife Federation in Annapolis, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf is currently a Sustainability Manager at Capital Region Water ("CRW") where, among other duties, she initiates and leads watershed management efforts,

including the permanent protection of the DeHart Reservoir Property through a paid conservation easement; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf has made presentations on sustainability issues at conferences and summits; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Dierolf has a professional affiliation with the International Society of Sustainability Professionals as a Sustainability Associate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HARRISBURG, that Ms. Tanya A. Dierolf is appointed to the Environmental Advisory Council for a term expiring September 25, 2021.


