

Hillsborough Township Awarded \$10,000 Sustainability Grant

One of Only Eight Town in New Jersey to Receive Funding



Hillsborough Township was awarded a \$10,000 Sustainable Jersey grant funded by the PSEG Foundation. Four \$20,000 grants, eight \$10,000 and twenty \$2,000 were distributed to a variety of projects including reclaiming paved surfaces for community gardens, protecting community tree cover, water conservation, green infrastructure, natural resources protection, park revitalization, promoting healthy lifestyles and green team capacity building.

"Thank you to all those individuals responsible, including our Business Advocate David Kois, for his dedication to applying for these grants on behalf of the Township," stated Mayor Frank DelCore.

"These grants support green teams and municipalities working to bring innovative sustainability projects forward that will shape the future of their residents for years to come," said Donna Drewes, who co-directs Sustainable Jersey with Randall Solomon.
