In addition to Hillsborough Police Department, PBA Local 205, having the the privilege of presenting the Honor Guard at the beginning of the game. Hillsborough resident, Mr. Tim Coyle, a 27 year Hillsborough resident, will be recognized during the *Hero of the Game* ceremony. Mr. Coyle has proudly served our country and our community. He was in the Air Force during the Vietnam Conflict - starting his military career as an Airman and working his way up to the rank of Sergeant. Mr. Coyle is a volunteer firefighter with Woods Road Fire Department and is the ex-Chief of the company. Mr. Coyle had the honor of being the Grand Marshal at last year's Hillsborough Memorial Day Parade and the special guest speaker for the 2017 Veterans Day Ceremony.

This joint fundraiser will benefit two different events - the Special Olympics New Jersey and the Wacker Family. PBA #205 and the Township participates each year in the Torch Run for Special Olympics, carrying the torch down Route 206 as part of the day-long event kicking off the Special Olympics Ceremony held in Trenton. Sergeant Fred Wacker passed away at his home unexpectedly on November 19, 2016. He was an eighteen year veteran who had served in many capacities in the Hillsborough Police Department.
