**PUBLIC HEARINGS**

Ordinance 2007-08      An Ordinance Providing for the Installation of Sanitary Sewer Lines and Related Expenses and Appropriating \$600,000, and Providing for the Issuance of \$570,000 in Bonds or Notes to Finance the Same, and Directing the Special Assessment of the Cost.

Township Clerk Kevin Davis stated that a copy of Ordinance 2007-08, along with the “Notice of Pending Bond Ordinance”, had been posted on the bulletin board outside of the Municipal Clerk’s Office since February 28<sup>th</sup> and was available, free of charge, to anyone who requested it. He said that all affected landowners had been property notified in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:49-6 and N.J.S.A. 40:49-2. Mr. Davis reported that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services received and returned a copy of the Supplemental Debt Statement.

Committeeman Suraci moved to open the public hearing on Ordinance 2007-08. Said motion was seconded by Committeeman Wagner and carried unanimously upon the call of the roll.

Mayor Ferrera said that this Ordinance was a special assessment bond ordinance for sewer connection construction in the Riverview Terrace and Hiland Drive area. Approval of the

bond ordinance would permit the Township and area residents to move forward on the sewer connection construction project.

Mayor Ferrera stressed that there would be no cost to taxpayers for this project, as the property owners in the affected area would pay 100% of the costs through a special assessment.

In response to a question from Committeeman Drake, Township Attorney Albert Cruz said that 31 of the 32 affected homeowners had signed contracts and that he had been advised that the remaining homeowner would return a signed contract shortly.

Committeeman Suraci moved to close the public hearing on Ordinance 2007-08. Said motion was seconded by Committeeman Wagner and carried unanimously upon call of the roll.
