PUBLIC HEARINGS

Ordinance 2007- 20 An Ordinance of the Township of Hillsborough, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey, providing for the installation of sanitary sewer lines along Arthur Road, Tara Drive, Brook Drive and Mountain View Road and related expenses, in the Township of Hillsborough and appropriating \$1,000,000 therefor, and providing for the issuance of \$500,000 in bonds or notes of the Township of Hillsborough to finance the same, and directing the special assessment of the cost thereof.

Committeeman Wagner moved to open the public hearing on Ordinance 2007-20. Said motion was seconded by Deputy Mayor Nisivoccia and carried unanimously upon the call of the roll.

Township Clerk Kevin Davis stated the following:

“A copy of this ordinance, along with the “Notice of Pending Bond Ordinance”, has been posted on the bulletin board outside of the Municipal Clerk’s Office since May 9th and has been made available, free of charge, to anyone requesting it. Furthermore, all of the affected landowners have been properly notified in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:49-6 and N.J.S.A. 40:49-2.

The Director of the Division of Local Government Services has received and returned a copy of the Supplemental Debt Statement.”

Mayor Ferrera stated that this ordinance provided the funding necessary for the construction of sewers in the Mountain View Road area, including Tara Drive, Brook Drive, and Arthur Road. He reiterated that there was no cost to Hillsborough taxpayers for this sewer construction project. All costs would be paid by property owners in the area through a special assessment and by a contribution from Beazer Homes, as part of the Pleasantview Estates development project.

The Mayor said that during the meeting there would be a public hearing, but that no action would be taken on the ordinance, as it requires at least four votes for approval.

The Mayor said that the ordinance would be listed for adoption at the July 10th meeting.

Committeeman Wagner moved to continue the public hearing on Ordinance 2007-20. Said motion was seconded by Deputy Mayor Nisivoccia and carried unanimously upon call of the roll.
