HISTORIC DISTRICT

HEARINGS

-Moose Club 5437 Broadway Sign

Mr. Paul Garland (Owner of Garland Graphics) came before the board to explain different ideas for the new sign. All of the designs were for a backlit sign but with variations to tone down the brightness of the sign. This proposal was with the understanding that if the board approved a backlit sign the Moose Club would remove the backlit sign that is on the pole. After some discussion, it was decided not to approve a backlit sign. Motion by Bill Harnack, seconded by Joe Giallanza not to approve this backlit sign but to reaffirm the approved wooden sign. Motion passed.

-Pat Taylor School of Dance 5497 Broadway Temporary Sign

This was not a true hearing because Ms. Taylor did not come before us but it lead to a discussion on temporary signs. It was decided that to erect a temporary sign it would not be necessary for residents to come before us but we would send some guide lines to the Building Dept. to let them know what we would recommend.

Those guide lines are as follows :

- 1.) Only sandwich style signs allowed.
- 2.) Signs are to be made of wood and not illuminated.
- 3.) The size of the sign is to be a maximum of 12 square feet each side.
- 4.) The time limit for the sign to be up is 7 days.

Motion by Mike Meyer, seconded by Paul Kendall to approve temporary signs with the above conditions. Motion passed.

Broadway

Guest Speaker: Senator Dale Volker

-Highlights of his speech:

- Russell of the D.O.T. told Sen. Volker that the next hearing would be sometime in the fall, probably in November. (Update: Feb.'95) The E.I.S. is done but they are waiting for a traffic study to be completed before they have the hearing.
- D.O.T. current plans cover Broadway from Transit to Central, with no work planned for the east end from Central to the Village line.
- When questioned about the new blacktop and cement curbing at corners, he said that they (D.O.T.) used materials available.
- He said that the costs for the project keep escalating.
- They hope to have the rest of the project done by the end of the decade.
- They said the road base is shot.
- It would cost \$109 million to do the Bowen Rd. extension.
- The state to pay for the relocation of the utility lines.
- He said the bridges are in bad shape.
- His suggestions are:
 - 1.) leave width as is
 - 2.) pour new curbing
 - 3.) redo bridges
 - 4.) no split of fed. and state monies
