## OLD BUSINESS

### Broadway Project

-Signs - Jim Keysa has most of the left over "Stop the Widening" signs at his office. We will ask Judy to update the permits to put the signs up again.

### Petitions

-Chris Brunea will write up a petition for the public to sign asking for the truck traffic to be taken off Broadway, for an alternative route ie: Walden Ave. & Cemetery Rd. and suggesting a possible solution to getting the majority of the truck traffic off of Broadway would be to raise the speed limit and/or lower the tolls on the Thruway. Motion by Jean Brunea, seconded by Joe Giallanza, to write a letter to the Village board informing them of these possible solutions. Motion passed. The petition and the letter to the Board will have the same information in it.

### Grants

-Neither Jim Keysa or anyone from O'Connell and Asso. had heard from any of our grant people at SHPO, so Jim called them for a status of our grant application . The person in charge of our application, Nancy Todd was not there but she will call Jim with an update.

### Village's Lead Agency for Widening Project

-Chris Brunea feels the lead agency for the Broadway project should be the Village Board its' self and not the Planning Board. Many of our Board members feel the same. Joe Giallanza said he will speak with the mayor in regards to this subject and let us know what Bill has to say.

### Shirts

-Ted or Jean dropped off the shirts that they had to Jim's office. Duane has some extra shirts, so together we have quite a few left.

## NEW BUSINESS

### Library Parking

-The Town of Lancaster paved a section of the lawn between the sidewalk and the street in front of the Lancaster library. The Village of Lancaster was not pleased that the Town did this without the Villages' knowledge or approval. This board agreed that this was not a good idea for safety or aesthetics. Bill Harnack will write a letter from the Historic Board to the Village Board letting them know that we do not approve of this parking situation and asking that it be restored back to the way it was.

### Extension of Historic District

-A request has been made by John Conlin, president of the Landmark Society of the Niagara Frontier, to extend the Lancaster Historic District to pick up some other buildings outside of the existing district. Some of the buildings that may be considered are in the Town of Lancaster. In order to do this we would need the approval of the Village and Town Boards and the State government. One of the buildings in the town would be the Hull/Peterson House on Genesee St. After some discussion, it was decided to make a list of possible eligible buildings for this extension.
