The Village of Lancaster, New York Historic District meeting was held in the Clerk-Treasurer's Office, 5423 Broadway, Lancaster, New York at 7:30 p.m. on February 22, 1989.

Motion by Jean Brunea, seconded by Johnstone Reid, Jr., to accept the minutes of the January 18, 1989 meeting.

Mr. Francis Fischer, 34 Church Street presented a sample of 5 inch Georgetown blue vinyl siding he would like to install on his house. Mr. Fischer will not make any change to pillars, eaves, or windows.

Chairman Keysa suggested a 3 to 4 inch siding which is more appropriate to the style of the house.

Motion by William Harnack, seconded by Johnstone Reid, Jr., to grant a Certificate of Appropriateness with triple three siding. Mr. Fischer to present a sample to Angelo Daluisio for approval. Mr. Daluisio to notify the clerk to issue a certificate.

Mr. Reid discussed printing of brochure by Catholic Charities. Discussion followed regarding the number to be printed. It was agreed on that 1,000 brochures be printed for the Fourth of July celebration.

Chairman Keysa directed the Clerk to send a letter to Mr. Schelgrin inviting him to attend the next Historic District meeting in March requesting preliminary information.


Jean Brunea suggested Mr. Peter Klasaaz also be invited.
