Mayor Brown called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. read the following statement and led the flag salute. Mayor Brown requested everyone to remain standing for a moment of silence for resident Jon Malkin.

Approval of Committee Minutes: Mayor entertained a motion to approve the minutes of the July 14, 2015 Meeting; so moved by Mr. Silva seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Riffle, Mr. Silva, Mayor Brown. Abstain: Ms. Rheault.

Public Discussion Relating to Agenda Items: None.

Committee Reports:

Public Works: Ms. Rheault reported Public Works has been very busy with storm clean-up and have been utilizing both chippers due to the amount of brush. Ms. Rheault requested consensus of the Governing Body to post for the Heavy Equipment Operator position. Ms. Rheault stated with Mr. Sperlak being appointed as Superintendent, we need to fill this vacancy and we have been notified by the Union that this position needs to be filled. Committee briefly discussed the position and its financial impact. Ms. Rheault stated she has requested the Clerk's Office procure contracts, and job descriptions for the position of Superintendent of Public Works to prepare for contract negotiations. Mayor Brown expressed his concern of retiring the chipper and Mr. Silva agreed to due safety concerns. Mr. Silva made motion to retire the chipper seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.

Department of Public Safety: Mr. Riffle reported National Night Out will be Tuesday, August 4th 5pm – 9pm at the Recreational Complex. Come out and support this police/community sponsored event!

Department of Administration: Mr. Gabris reported the following: Yard Sale sponsored by Mullica Twp. Seniors & Mullica in the Pines Historical Society will be held on Saturday, August 8, 2015 from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. at the Mullica in the Pines Historical Society, Nesco Road.

Mr. Gabris reported two air conditioners were installed at the Hilda Frame School.

New Business:

Resolution #102-2015 / Extend 3rd Quarter Interest and Tax Payment: Mayor Brown entertained a motion to extend; so moved by Mr. Silva seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.

Resolution #103-2015 / Approve Coin Drop Application / Elwood Fire Co. / October 3, 2015: Mayor Brown entertained a motion to approve; so moved by Ms. Rheault seconded by Mr. Silva. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.

Resolution #104-2015 / Supporting NJDOT Traffic Regulation Order - "No Passing Zones": Mayor Brown entertained to support; so moved by Mr. Gabris seconded by Ms. Rheault. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.

Resolution #105-2015 / Opposing to Expand Statewide Casino Gambling Beyond Atlantic City: Mayor Brown entertained a motion to oppose; so moved by Mr. Silva seconded by Mayor Brown. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Riffle, Mr. Silva, Mayor Brown. Nays: Ms. Rheault stated she is in favor of this Resolution; however, this type of Resolution is out of our hands and suggested we contact our legislators individually. Mr. Silva stated it is important as a Committee to address this opposition.

Payment of Bills: Mayor entertained a motion to approve the Bill List so moved by Mr. Silva seconded by Mr. Mr. Riffle. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.

Public Discussion:

Mr. Francis Paulsgraf commented that the trash has been removed from the property at 5th Avenue and the White Horse Pike, asked the status of the pipe line issue at the Pinelands Commission and the position of Zoning Officer. Mayor Brown and Ms. Rheault stated a vote was taken at the Pinelands by a sub-committee, but believes it still needs to be presented to the full Commission. Mayor Brown stated Mr. Toussaint is the temporary zoning official until the end of the year.

Clerk read Resolution ES10-15 in full, to discuss, Ejectment of persons in wrongful possession of municipal property, James Wild vs. Mullica Township, unemployment issue, heavy equipment operator vacancy and to review Executive Session Minutes.

Ms. Rheault moved to come back to Regular Session at 8:15 pm seconded by Mr. Silva. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Ms. Rheault, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown. Clerk reported in Executive Session the Governing Body was updated on the ejectment of persons in wrongful possession of municipal property, James Wild vs. Mullica Township, discussed an unemployment issue, discussed heavy equipment vacancy and reviewed the Executive Session Minutes of June 23, 2015.

Mayor Brown entertained a motion to adjourn; so moved by Ms. Rheault seconded by Mr. Silva. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.
