Mayor Brown called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. read the following statement and led the flag salute:

Approval of Committee Minutes: Mayor entertained a motion to approve the minutes of October 11th; so moved by Ms. Polk seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Public Discussion Relating to Agenda Items: None.

First Reading: Ordinance 11-2011 / Accept Land / Block 4161, Lot 3: Mayor entertained a motion to read by title; so moved by Ms. Polk seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

An Ordinance Authorizing the Acceptance of Unimproved Land Designated Block 4161, Lot 3, on the Tax Map of the Township of Mullica by the Township of Mullica, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey.

Mayor entertained a motion to approve and set hearing date for November 22, 2011, 7pm; so moved by Ms. Polk seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Committee Reports:

Public Safety: Mr. Graebener reported the following: The Police Department investigated the following from October 11, 2011 through October 24, 2011, arrests 14, motor vehicle accidents 8, motor vehicle stops 126, summons issued 87, warnings 1, D.W.I. 5 (total for the year 63), calls for service year-to-date 11,245. Remember Monday, October 31, 2011 Trick or Treating will be celebrated from 6pm – 8pm, please look for Trick or Treaters who will be out and about during this time period. Municipal Court collected \$24,997.75.00 for the month of September and the municipality retained \$11,492.53. Nesco Volunteer Fire Company is holding their Haunted House and Hayride on October 28th and 29th from 7pm – 11pm. Cost is \$10.00.

Administration: Ms. Polk reported the following: The 18th Annual Halloween Parade will be held on Sunday, October 30th, registration begins at 12 noon, and parade begins promptly at 1pm. All ages are welcome to participate. The front of our building looks so beautiful with our fall decorations. We would like to thank

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Green Thumb for their kind donation of the hay bales, corn stalks, pumpkins and mums. Our parking lot has been lined for parking spaces. We thank Capaldi Brothers for donating their time and work. November 8, 2011

Municipal Offices closed for General Election (The Township Clerk's Office will remain open during polling hours). November 11, 2011 Municipal Offices closed for Veteran's Day. November 24th & 25th Municipal Offices closed for the Thanksgiving holiday. Ms. Polk announced Mullica Township has achieved bronze Sustainable Jersey certification and thanked all the community members and employees for their efforts. Ms. Polk invited everyone to join her at her home on Friday for a celebration. Ms. Polk stated the focus for 2012 will be working with the school and their first goal is a school garden. Mayor congratulated Ms. Polk and her team in achieving this goal.

Public Works: Mr. Riffle reported the following: The Township does not provide curb side leaf pick up, residents may bring their leaves to the transfer station and dispose of in the leaf pile. The transfer station was inspected by the County Health Dept on October 17th and received a very good report, in compliance with all requirements.

Housing & Development: Mr. Gabris encouraged residents to attend the Seniors Citizen Meetings held the third Wednesday of each month at the Elwood Fire Company and the Historical Society Meetings held the third Tuesday of each month at Town Hall.

Correspondence:

Thank you from Terence Watson to the Public Works Department for their efforts and hard work in preparing the fields for the 3rd Annual Fall Soccer Festival.

Hamilton Township will hold a public hearing on their Master Plan Re-Examination on November 3rd, 7pm at Hamilton Township Municipal Building.

Notification that Mullica Township has achieved bronze Sustainable Jersey certification.

Correspondence from Lake Nescochague Association seeking to discussion Block 701, Lot 14 as meaningful access. Clerk read letter in full. Mr. Graebener suggested creating a sub-committee. Mr. Gabris suggested forwarding that correspondence to the County. Mayor noted the County has created a sub-committee and agreed to forward the letter and await a response from the County. Mr. John Walther, Nescochague Lake Association, reported they had received a preliminary engineer's report regarding the dam and the recommendation is to fix the pipe (auxiliary spillway). Mr. Walther gave a brief description of the damage and the remedy. Clerk to forward correspondence to County and request meeting.

Request from Mullica Woods to waive \$25.00 application fee for a hearing. Mr. Gabris so moved to waive the fee, seconded by Mr. Graebener. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

New Business:

Approve Raffle 3-2011 / Mullica PTA – Benefits MTEF: Mayor entertained a motion to approve; so moved by Ms. Polk seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

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Waive Permit Fee / Raffle 3-2011: Mayor entertained a motion to approve the local fee; so moved by Ms. Polk seconded by Mr. Graebener. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Accept Resignation / Judge Henry Broome: Mr. Gabris moved to accept seconded by Ms. Polk. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Discuss Municipal Court Judge Vacancy: Mr. Gabris stated he spoke with the Court Administrator for her preference and she stated a local judge would be helpful. Mayor recommended the remaining judges who submitted resumes sit in Mullica so our Court can have an opportunity to work with all who are interested. Mayor stated there was no urgency to fill the unexpired term. Ms. Polk stated she would like Judge William Cappuccio to have the position. Mr. Graebener made a motion to appoint Mr. William Cappuccio to fill the unexpired term seconded by Ms. Polk. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk. Nays: Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Payment of Bills: Ms. Polk made a motion to approve the Bill List seconded by Mr. Graebener. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Ms. Polk stated on November 5th, Sustainable Mullica will be conducting an adopt-a-road clean-up beginning at the Egg Harbor Cemetery at 9am.

Public Discussion:

Ms. Kathy Dickerson, Mullica Woods's resident, thanked Committee for waiving the fee and asked if the pad fee would be on the complaint or would it be addressed before the Governing Body. Mr. Graebener stated that is a Governing Body issue. Ms. Dickerson asked Committee if they would request from Hometown America their financials, to assist them in their complaint. Committee consented to request.

Mr. Paul Williams, Mullica Woods's resident, stated over the past eight years the rent has increased over \$200.00 per month and the Township receives \$40,000 in pad fees which should be reviewed.

Ms. Joy Ramer thanked Committee for the dead end sign on cemetery road, noting it has basically eliminated commercial traffic, advised Committee the Elwood Cemetery cannot hold any burials until it is recognized by the State, reported there is still a water issue in the area and requested before anything else is graded or re-directed to speak with her. Mayor reported he visited the area after the last rainstorm and the water issue is due to the run-off from the school, not from the grading of the roadway.

Ms. Mildred Pauls, Mullica Wood's resident, stated she moved into the community eleven years ago and her lot rent was \$427.00 a month and now it is \$650.00 a month and they don't maintain the lawns, plow driveways, etc. and Committee has done nothing to assist the residents.

Mr. Paul Williams stated the residents are their own caretakers of their areas, and the company does very little to assist them.

Ms. Joann Jones, Mullica Wood's resident, stated many residents have to purchase water, because it smells of chlorine.

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Mayor Brown stated many of the issues being reported are between the tenants and the owners of the property and should be addressed to the landlord. Mr. Graebener suggested revisiting the Ordinance to lower the cost of living increase.

Mayor Brown closed public portion and entertained a motion to enter Executive Session. Ms. Polk so moved to enter Executive Session seconded by Mr. Graebener. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown. Clerk read Resolution ES14-2011 in full to discuss personnel and review executive session minutes.

Ms. Polk moved to come back to Regular Session at 8:50 pm seconded by Mr. Graebener. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown. Mayor reported in Executive Session the Governing Body reviewed executive session minutes, discussed the positions of Chief of Police and Police Captain and reported on the interviews for these positions.

Mayor entertained a motion to appoint Captain John Thompson as Chief of Police effective January 1, 2012, and to negotiate a contract for 2012; so moved by Mr. Riffle seconded by Mr. Gabris. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Mr. Graebener made a motion to appoint Sgt. Brian Zeck as Police Captain effective January 1, 2012, and to negotiate a contract for 2012 seconded by Ms. Polk. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Mr. Graebener, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown.

Approve Executive Session Minutes: Ms. Polk moved to approve the minutes of September 27, 2011, seconded by Mr. Riffle. RCV: Yeas: Mr. Gabris, Ms. Polk, Mr. Riffle, Mayor Brown. Abstain: Mr. Graebener.

Ms. Polk moved to adjourn seconded by Mr. Graebener. RCV: Yeas: All voted yes.
