Clerk confirmed we have no regulations. Ms. Maskos stated in her neighborhood a home is being utilized as such. Committee stated they will investigate.

Mr. Silva stated earlier this year Committee discussed the need of defibrillators and asked Chief Thompson to explain a recent incident that occurred. Chief explained on October 26th at the change of shift a call came in for a un-responsive person with CPR in progress. Chief stated the oncoming Officer had an AED in their vehicle was able to arrive in moments and thanks to the efforts of Sergeant Silva, Captain Zeck and volunteer firefighter Brian Beals saved the resident.
