Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer's report was read and approved.

Specifications and bids for the Village Truck were then opened and read by the Clerk. They were as follows:

Police reports from Officers Obrien and Simmons were read and approved.

A petition signed by 56 persons was read by the Mayor requesting that No. Parsonage street be discontinued as an entrance to the Stock Cars races. In conjunction with this Mr. Heeb and Mr. Tieder asked that a Deputy be placed at the corner of Parsonage and Livingston Sts. and one at Parsonage and Chestnut Sts. to cut down the speeding through these streets. Gustave Ebers, Charles Fraleigh, and Mr. Cole concurred in this.

The Board stated that it had no authority to close the gate at the end of Parsonage St. Mayor Pollard suggested that perhaps the Race Committee would consider closing the gate at 9:30 so that no exit could be had from that gate inasmuch as most of the complaint was directed at after the races are over. This was placed in form of a motion by Trustee Delamater, seconded by Trustee Snyder and passed.

Gil Haines asked about the petition of the people of Park Plaza. The Mayor informed him that the situation was pending the return of Harry Hill from Europe.

The Street Committee report was read and accepted as was the Fire Report and the report of the Zoning Committee

The clerk was directed to write to Mr. Shapiro of the Hudson Valley Dept Store and inform him that he should not place his trash out on Montgomery St. until the collector was coming for it.

A letter from Dick Murray requesting the usual fair-week privileges of the Board was read and permission granted.

A letter from Frank Traver suggesting changes in the insurance coverage of the Village was read. On motion of Trustee Neale seconded by Trustee Snyder and passed the suggestions were approved.

The Mayor appointed Trustees Neale and Delamater to see about securing The Schwartz land on W. Market and Oak Sts. for a Village parking lot.

The board approved a motion by Trustee Delamater, seconded by Trustee Neale that the Village make a donation of \$100. to the 156 F.A. Battalion in Kingston.

On motion of Trustee Delamater, seconded by Trustee Snyder and passed by the board the regular meetings of the Board were changed to the second Monday of the month, starting with the July meeting.

Mr. Ryan and Mr. Northrup of the Twin Meter Sales Co. appeared and demonstrated and talked about their parking meter.

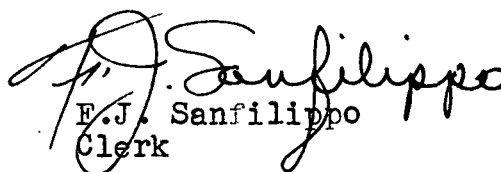

The Street department report was read and approved. It was reported that the Budd situation was cleared up.

Ex-Mayor Wheeler recommended that parking on the East Side of Mill Street on the North corner of South street be prohibited for a distance from the corner. He said that when anyone parks a car there- and especially when trucks are parked there- it is difficult to see when coming around the corner.

Letter from the Board of Education was read urging that something be done about the speed of cars along E. Market St. from Parsonage St. to Town Hall. Trustee Delamater suggested getting the help of the State Police.

The businessman of the Village questioned why trash collection in the Village did not include their stores.

The Mayor read pertinent parts of the report of the State Auditors examination. As requested by the auditors the Board authorized the Treasurer to set up a Petty Cash fund of \$50.00. The motion was made by Trustee Neale and seconded by Trustee Yager.

Sam Lloyd offered a telegram from the Ford motor car Co. to substantiate his claim about the Village Truck. Attorney Harry Hill said that as far as he can find out everything was legal in the sale of the truck.
