

February 10, 2015

The meeting of the Royersford Borough Council was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by President Tom Weikel at Royersford Borough Hall, 300 Main Street, Royersford, Pa.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was followed by roll call.

Present: M. Bullick, P. Chrisman, A. Dham, J. Kring, A. Metricarti, M. Stehman, and T. Weikel  
Also present: Mayor J. Guest, Solicitor R. Brant, and Manager M. Leonard

The minutes of the January 13<sup>th</sup> & January 27, 2015 meetings were approved as distributed upon a motion by A. Dham seconded by M. Stehman. Motion passed unanimously.

#### BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT:

Manager Leonard introduced Mario Dinenna who was interested in buying 324 Main Street and wanted to present some ideas to Council. Council stated that parking was the issue and needed to be resolved.

Manager Leonard presented a letter of intent and notification to Council from the Police Department to enter into collective bargaining pursuant to Act 111. Council President Weikel appointed A. Dham, M. Bullick and M. Stehman to the negotiation committee for the Police contract.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Disbursements in the amount of \$134,429.48 were presented and authorized paid upon motion by J. Kring seconded by A. Dham. Motion passed unanimously.

#### WASTE WATER COMMITTEE:

P. Chrisman reported the generator at the Waste Water Treatment Plant needs to be repaired, there are two estimates for repairing the generator Emergency Systems Service Company \$17,923.00 and Penn Power Systems \$11,517.26. Motion by P. Chrisman seconded by A. Dham to award Penn Power Systems the contract to repair the generator in the amount of \$11,517.26. Motion passed unanimously.

**PARKS & RECREATION COMMITTEE:**

The minutes of the February 5, 2015 committee meeting were presented and accepted upon motion by A. Metricarti seconded by M. Bullick. The motion passed unanimously.

**PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE:**

M. Bullick reported the Police Department ran the Enradd machine on Second Avenue for 4 days and one day on Main Street near Nelson's Ice cream store.

M. Bullick reported that there was a fire at 7<sup>th</sup> and Oak Street, with good team work between the Police and the Public Works Department they were able to put the fire out with minimum damage.

**PERSONNEL COMMITTEE:**

A. Dham reported that there are two positions on the Freedom House Board of Directors any resident interested please let him know.

**SOLICITOR:**

Solicitor Brant reported on the rental registration and inspection in question from the last meeting. The new check list with the changes to reflect the comments from the previous meeting was distributed to Council. A. Dham wanted our solicitor to eliminate on the check list laundry rooms for needing a ground fault receptacle. The inspection fees were going to be by resolution. The solicitor is to fill in any blanks on the ordinance and send it to Council for review. There were comments regarding how to charge for inspection fees.

Solicitor Brant suggested that he fix the permit parking ordinance and have it for the next Council meeting.

Solicitor Brant stated that Manager Leonard received a phone call and a letter from Lynne Z. Gold-Bikin regarding 451 Main Street, and the parking issue of "no parking" on Main Street from 3 AM-5 AM. Ms. Gold-Bikin stated that with these restrictions it makes her property non-saleable. Council discussed this issue many times regarding this parking issue. Council decided to keep the no parking from 3 AM – 5 PM.

**MAYOR:**

Mayor Guest wanted to let Council know that PSAB is going to have a television show every two months with issues effecting Boroughs.

Mayor Guest reminded Council if there is an issue that affects our Borough or any other Borough in the State the Borough Council can put the issue into resolution form and send it to the Borough's Association Policy Resolution Steering Committee for consideration. Mayor Guest and Tom Weikel are members of the Policy Resolution Steering Committee for PSAB.

**ADJOURNMENT:**

The meeting was adjourned at 7:46 PM upon a motion by M. Bullick seconded by M. Stehman. The motion passed unanimously.
