

January 29, 2019

The regular meeting of the Royersford Borough Council was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by President Anil Dham at Royersford Borough Hall, 300 Main Street, Royersford, Pa.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was followed by roll call.

Present: A. Demchik, A. Dham, A. Metricarti, J. Moskal, T. Moyer, M. Stehman, T. Weikel, Mayor J. Antoniewicz, and Manager M. Leonard.

Council had a presentation from Mark Shumaker on behalf of Marshal Granor and Joe Price who donated a scale model of the Riverwalk Development. The Borough appreciates the donation. The scale model of the development is mounted on the wall at Borough Hall.

The Borough presented a plaque to Pat Weikel for 30 years of service to the Park & Recreation Committee.

**VISITORS:**

No visitors spoke at the meeting.

The Treasurers Report and Sewer & Solid Waste Collection Reports for December 2018 were presented and accepted upon motion by T. Weikel seconded by T. Moyer. Motion passed unanimously.

**BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT:**

Manager Leonard presented to Council Resolution #2019-02 approval for the subdivision plan at South 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Main Street that will be purchased by Royersford Borough. Motion by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti. Motion passed unanimously.

Manager Leonard reported on the traffic lights at 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue & 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue on Main Street. The company is finished; they are just clearing up some problems on the way the traffic lights work.

Manager Leonard reported on the boat dock. The insurance company paid for the damage of the dock and the damaged parts have been ordered.

Manager Leonard reported on Norfolk Southern closing the crossings at Main Street and Arch Street.

Manager Leonard updated Council on the take back of Main Street and 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.

Manager Leonard asked Council if they were okay with disassembling the jail cell.

Manager Leonard asked Council to appoint Corporal Fennelly the Right to Know Officer for the Police Department. Motion by T. Weikel seconded by M. Stehman.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE:**

Disbursements in the amount of \$203,309.74 were presented and authorized paid upon motion by T. Weikel seconded by M. Stehman. The motion passed unanimously.

**WASTE WATER COMMITTEE:**

The report of the Waste Water Treatment Plant Superintendent for the month of December 2018 was presented and accepted upon motion of M. Stehman seconded by A. Demchik. Motion passed unanimously.

**PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE/CODE ENFORCEMENT:**

The report of the Director of Public Works for the month of December 2018 was presented and accepted upon motion of A. Demchik seconded by J. Moskal. Motion passed unanimously.

The end of the year report of the Public Works Department was presented and accepted upon motion of A. Demchik seconded by T. Moyer. The motion passed unanimously.

**PARK & RECREATION COMMITTEE:**

The minutes of the January 3, 2019 committee meeting were presented and accepted upon motion by T. Moyer seconded by J. Moskal. Motion passed unanimously.

**PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE:**

The report of the Chief of Police for the month of December 2018 was presented and accepted upon a motion by J. Moskal seconded by M. Stehman. The motion passed unanimously.

J. Moskal reported that the Police Committee would like The Department of Community and Economic Development to do a management study of the Police Department. Motion by J. Moskal seconded by A. Metricarti to do the police management study. Motion passed unanimously.

Council discussed the placement of the speed control trailers.

The report of the Borough Fire Marshal for the month of December 2018 was presented and accepted upon motion by J. Moskal seconded by M. Stehman. The motion passed unanimously.

**PERSONNEL COMMITTEE: No Report**

The Parking Committee is going to meet with the Borough Engineer regarding the parking lots.

**PLANNING COMMISSION: No Report**

A. Dham handed out to Council sales data on borough real estate.

A. Dham reported that "Parks on Tap" will be held on July 17, 2019 to July 21, 2019 down along the river on First Avenue.

A. Dham reported that there will be a professional tree climbing competition at Victory Park on September 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>.

Council President A. Dham reported on the trestle project. The awards of the DCED Grant will take place on Tuesday January 29, 2019.

**MAYOR:**

Mayor Antoniewicz reported the minutes of the Civil Service meeting held on January 23, 2019 to certify the list for a potential full time police position. Motion to approve the meeting minutes of the Civil Service Commission by T. Weikel seconded by M. Stehman. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Antoniewicz reported on the mental health series.
