

October 13, 2020

The regular meeting of the Royersford Borough Council was called to order at 7:15 pm by President Anil Dham at Royersford Borough Hall, 300 Main Street, Royersford, Pa.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was followed by roll call.

VISITORS:

Paul Chrisman 750 Main Street suggested different ways to invest the proceeds of the sale of the sewer plant and suggested a reduction in property tax. He also suggested looking into imposing an Amusement Tax as a way to get more income.

Approval of the September 8 & September 29, 2020 meeting minutes by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti. Motion passed unanimously.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Manager Leonard reported to Council that the Hill School will provide insurance for the boat dock moving forward. The boat dock will be back in the water on October 14, 2020.

Manager Leonard reported that the CDBG road work on Church Street will start at the end of week October 12, 2020 with the handicap ramps at Church Street and Lewis Road, followed by mill and overlay.

Manager Leonard reported that Phase 3 of the trail is on schedule and should be done by the end of the year.

Manager Leonard reported to Council that myself and Dave Kee will be meeting with Spring City regarding the subdivision for the trestle bridge.

Assistant Manager D. Ziegler reported that Jamie Pistilli at 611 Green Street is requesting that the 600 Block of Green Street be closed at 6th Avenue and at the rear access road to Spring Ford 9th Grade Center for a neighborhood Halloween party from 5 PM to 10 PM. The Borough Council has no problem approving the request to close the road as long as they check with Upper Providence and Limerick Township for their approval. Motion by M. Stehman seconded by A. Demchik. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Disbursements in the amount of \$307,217.00 were presented and accepted and authorized to pay upon motion by T. Weikel seconded by T. Moyer. The motion passed unanimously.

T. Weikel reported to Council that the ordinance committee is working on a snow ordinance that should be ready for advertisement at the October 27th meeting.
