Chairman Naccarato called the meeting to order at 6 PM.

**SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT:** Patricia Jones, representing the Sheriff's Office, presented two resolutions for consideration. The first resolution requested that \$66,000 be transferred from Inmate Board-out Line A4-1855-4378 to Jail Overtime Line A4-1855-1901 and an additional \$11,000 from the Inmate Board-Out Line to the Jail Part-time Line A4-1855-1807 to cover the amount of overtime pay due to unanticipated personnel vacancies and mandated training. Motion moved by Leg. Hathaway, seconded by Leg. Dart to approve. All voted in favor.

The second resolution for consideration was for \$84,000 (\$17,000 from Regular Pay Line A4-1814-1005 and \$67,000 from Contingent A4-1990-1331) to be transferred to the Part-time Line A4-1810-1807 (\$10,000) and the Overtime Line A4-1810 (\$74,000). Motion moved by Leg. Dart, seconded by Leg. Wilkins. All voted in favor.

**EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT:** Art Snyder gave his monthly report and brought the committee up-to-date on what has been happening during the past month. A copy is attached to these minutes. He gave an update on the anthrax threat at the Marlboro Post Office. Leg. Dart asked about the haz-mat equipment. His questions were answered thoroughly.

**TRAFFIC SAFETY BOARD:** Charles Schaller, Chairman of the Traffic Safety Board, presented the committee with a report on the Selective Enforcement Program from October 1, 2000 to September 30, 2001. A copy of said report is attached to these minutes.
