Rick Fritschler of EMC said a \$35,000 grant was approved by DEC for full scale printer supplies and equipment that are needed for software.

Mr. Fritschler also presented the Committee with two letters; one from the Town of Ulster Supervisor and the other from the Town of Saugerties, thanking the students for appearing before the Town Board on April 22, 1997. They gave a presentation regarding lower Esopus Creek. The program was called Learn and Serve America and they found it very informative.

Mr. Fritschler presented a resolution recommending that the County of Ulster buy the property that is known as the former Brigham brickyard. The Committee members recommended that no action be taken.

A resolution was sent to the Committee from the NYS Fish and Wildlife Management Board asking for support of the resolution called City Coalition Watershed. On motion made by Legislator Calabrese, seconded by Legislator Tantillo, and all in favor, the resolution was accepted.

Jonathan Van Vlack of the Consumer Fraud Bureau sent a memo reminding the Committee of Tuesday, May 13, to attend a public meeting in the Legislative Chambers at 1:00 P.M. by the Public Service Commission on competitive electricity. At 2:30 P.M. there will be an opportunity for public comment.

There being no further business, on motion made by Legislator Aiello and seconded by Legislator Spada, the meeting adjourned.
