There was a resolution from the Public Defender's Office requesting \$40,000 be put in line AA-A-1120-0-4510 to cover assigned counsel through the remainder of 1995. This was moved by Legislator Hathaway, seconded by Legislator Carle and passed with Legislator O'Reilly voting no.

There was another resolution from the Public Defender's Office requesting funds be put in line items for office supplies (\$200), misc. and contractual (\$1,500), fees for service (\$7,000), part time (70,000) and \$952 from repayment to attorney's fees from contingency. This was moved by Legislator Tantillo, seconded by Legislator Contini and unanimously passed.

The District Attorney's Office presented a resolution requesting \$39,500 to finish out the year plus \$6,480 for special prosecutor's fees (Dutchess Co.). This was moved by Legislator Hathaway and seconded by Legislator Tantillo.

Art Snyder gave his monthly report.

The Sheriff's Department presented a resolution transferring \$121,130 from contingency to line item AA-A-3150-0-4400.

This resolution was moved by Legislator Carle, seconded by Legislator Tantillo and passed, with Legislator O'Reilly voting no.

There was a resolution requesting transfer of \$4,000 into the security services courts part-time line item from the personnel line. This was moved by Legislator Tantillo, seconded by Legislator Carle and adopted.

There was a resolution requesting transfer of \$10,000 into security services court over-time line item from the personnel line. This was moved by Legislator Hathaway, seconded by Legislator Contini and adopted.

There was a resolution request to transfer \$21,000 into the Sheriff's over-time line item from the personnel line. This was moved by Legislator Hathaway, seconded by Legislator O'Reilly and adopted.

There was a resolution requesting \$38,000 to purchase three vehicles for the detective and civil divisions. This resolution was put on hold until Chairman Naccarato talks with Majority Leader Sinagra. No action was taken.

There was a resolution requesting transfer of \$42,916.83 into the Sheriff's Office Correction Division budget from the personnel salary line. Jail overtime line has been depleted. There were unanticipated expenditures of funds due to jail overcrowding. This resolution was moved by Legislator Carle, seconded by Legislator Hathaway and passed.

There was a resolution from Alternative Sentencing authorizing the Chairman of the Legislature to enter into an agreement continuing a dedicated work crew for the City of Kingston from January 1, 1996 through December 31, 1996, with the City of Kingston purchasing such from Ulster County Alternative Sentencing. This was moved by Legislator Hathaway, seconded by Legislator Contini and adopted.

There being no further business, on motion made by Legislator O'Reilly and seconded by Legislator Carle, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 P.M.
