Charles Shaw, Director of the Resource Recovery Agency, reported on his agency. The SAC on Sawkill Road will be opening soon. It will accept cardboard, plastic and metal cans. Most towns' landfills will be properly closed by the end of 1995.

Mitch Manzo of EMC presented a draft list of possible pesticides on or in Ulster County property. Remediation may be expensive.

On motion made by Legislator Donaldson, seconded by Legislator Busick and carried, a resolution regarding a DEC grant was accepted. Mr. Manzo will secure information to substantiate the resolution.

Bill Smith of Federated Sportsman said 160 bears were taken, and 60% were females. There is a very good food crop for animals this season. The DEC will be asked to open deer season with regard to bear season. There is much money generated in sales tax.

Jonathan Van Vlack of Consumer Fraud Bureau indicated there have been complaints of people regarding fundraisers. Certain information must be given by the solicitor and must be told upfront. He presented a press release regarding the same matter:
