Jon Van Vlack of the Consumers Fraud Bureau gave his report. The budget is coming up and it looks like more people are needed. The office now depends on volunteers.

There was general discussion on Greenway by the Committee.

There was a motion opposing use of chlorine and chemicals made by Legislator Bischoff and seconded by Legislator Donaldson. It was carried unanimously.

Shirley Kobran spoke on the siting process from 1989 to the present. The Committee agreed to have Legislator Roberts draft a resolution on disposal for the June meeting.

Cary MacDonald of EMC reported on the cancer awareness coalition from last month. Aerial spraying is an issue.

Bill Smith of Federated Sportsman indicated that he will serve on Ellenville's village committee regarding the sale of 4,000 acres on the Shawangunk Mountains. If a sale is made, certain restrictions must be put in.

Chairman Dunn ruled Legislators Bischoff's and O'Reilly's resolution for the RRA to cease and desist out of order.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:05 P.M.
