OTHERS ATTENDING: Steve Morris, Probation Department; Sheriff Michael LaPaglia; Thomas Turco, Weights & Measures; Duncan Wilson, Fire Coordinator; Art Snyder, Emergency Mgt.

Steve Morris, Director of the Probation Department, submitted a resolution to increase the departmental budget overall by \$6,020. On motion made by Legislator Bauer and seconded by Legislator Crespino, the motion passed.

Sheriff Michael LaPaglia submitted a resolution to contract for services and fee schedule with the Town of Kingston for services of a part-time Deputy Sheriff, with the car belonging to the Town of Kingston. Legislator O'Reilly asked who will pay insurance on the car, and the answer was the Town of Kingston. It was noted that the Sheriff will be responsible for liability. The Sheriff will give services on a needed basis.

On motion made by Legislator Carle and seconded by Legislator Contini, the motion passed. Legislator O'Reilly voted no.

Sheriff LaPaglia also presented the N.I.C. report on the jail.

Thomas Turco, Director of Weights and Measures, submitted a resolution to extend the 1993 state contract to 1995 and \$22,800 within three years.

A motion was made by Legislator Carle and seconded by Legislators Crespino and Bauer to extend the state contract to 1995.

Duncan Wilson, Fire Coordinator, reported that he had a meeting with the New York State Thruway to promote better cooperation. The tower in Highland may be paid for by the State. Mr. Wilson also gave his monthly report.

Arthur Snyer, Director of Emergency Management, gave his monthly report (see attached).

On motion made by Legislator Crespino and seconded by Legislator Bauer, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 P.M.
