Manna Jo Greene briefed the Committee on the status of state and federal packaging legislation. The Committee will investigate memorializing the state to initiate package legislation.

Doug Bell of James Bay Action Network requested that the Committee not act on the resolution to cancel the Hydro Quebec contract until it receives the energy report on the contract from the state. The resolution was not acted on.

Federated Sportsman President Bill Smith reported on their pheasant program, blood drive and the Greenway project. Jay Martin, Vice President, reported on youth activities.

Bill Trumphour and Ted Hilscher addressed the Committee on a proposal to build a regional landfill in New Baltimore along the New York State Thruway. The proposed landfill would serve Ulster, Green and Columbia Counties and would be managed by Waste Management, Inc. Messrs. Trumphour and Hilscher represent Northern Catskill Resources, Inc., brokers for the project.
