

REGULAR WORK SESSION

The Regular Work Session of the City Council of the City of Vineland was called to order by the President, Anthony R. Fanucci.

President Fanucci led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Municipal Clerk stated Public Notice of this meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given on April 23, 2013 by the City Clerk in the following manner:

1. Posting written notice on the official bulletin board in the lobby of the City Hall on;
2. Providing written notice to the offices of The Daily Journal and The Press of Atlantic City;
3. Filing written notice in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Vineland.

Director of Economic Development, Sandy Forosisky, explained the second generation UEZ loan to the Elks Club for the improvements to 18 S. Eighth Street. This is the old Reliance Fire Hall and the lower level will contain a firefighter museum.

President Fanucci asked if anyone from the public wished to comment. There was no public comment.

Comptroller, Roxanne Tosto, briefly described the requirement to amend the 2013 municipal budget. She said the main issue was that we used up all of the budgeted money for natural gas in only 4 months. The electric utility is assisting to determine how to reduce these costs. It could be the agreement with the gas marketer. They are also looking at energy consumption. President Fanucci said he wants departments held accountable for overages in utility budgets.

The Clerk reviewed the agenda.

The Clerk reminded City Council members about filing their Financial Disclosure Statements, and offered assistance from his office if Council members need it.

Business Administrator Monaco reported work to be done by South Jersey Gas Company at the Peach Street and Boulevard site. This will likely involve the boulevard being closed for up to 6 months. The gas company will be working with residents to help them better deal with the expected noise, odor and vibration concerns.

Councilman Procopio questioned some estimates on bid proposals. Ms. Monaco will investigate the matters. Councilman Procopio also asked for assistance from Council colleagues to help him at the tent for the May 17 and 18 Founder's Day program.

Councilwoman Gonzalez reported that work continues in the planning for the Fourth Friday Family Fun & Fitness event planned for June 28.

Councilwoman Calakos received a thank you from Dr. Tom McCann for her participation in the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the Vineland High School 11-12 building.
